6:45 p.m. Informal Session:

Avraam Budman, 14 Donna Road, spoke with the Selectmen concerning charges incurred from the Water Department's fixing a water valve at his home. Mr. Matthews asked the Town Manager review the bill again and also explained to Mr. Budman that the Town must recover the cost for the work.

7:00 p.m. Call to Order:

A meeting of the Board of Selectmen was convened by Chairman Daniel P. Matthews at 7:00 p.m. Those present were: Gerald Wasserman, Maurice Handel, Town Manager Kate Fitzpatrick, and Recording Secretary Mary Hunt. John Bulian and Denise Garlick were not present.

Public Hearing - Verizon Petition for New Pole – Fletcher Road: Dick Burgio, Verizon Communications appeared before the Board of Selectmen to request permission for a new pole, number P371/0, on Fletcher Road.

Motion by Mr. Wasserman that the Board of Selectmen approve and sign petition from Verizon to place new pole, number P371/0, on the southerly side of Fletcher Road, at the corner of Fletcher Road and Chestnut Street. This new pole is requested by NSTAR via the Town of Needham Engineering Department. New pole is staked and will allow for the transfer of utilities without causing an aerial trespass.

7:10 p.m. Town Manager Report:

Ms. Fitzpatrick appeared before the Board with an update on 2 items:

1. Administrative Reorganization of the Department of Public Works: Ms. Fitzpatrick stated the Operations Study of the Department of Public Works presented by the Mercer Group in July 2008 made many recommendations which have been acted upon. Most important has been the creation of the Assistant Director of Public Works and the Assistant Purchasing Agent/Office Manager positions. Both positions were created without the need to increase headcount. These two newly created positions, and other changes recommended by the

Mercer Group, will help service delivery within town. The new Department of Public Works building has been designed with an open floor plan which will help with communication flow and span of control between various departments.

2. 112 Edgewater Drive: Ms. Fitzpatrick stated a perimeter fence has been installed by the property owner as a safety measure. The Town expects the property owner to move forward with the project and will continue to monitor the situation.
