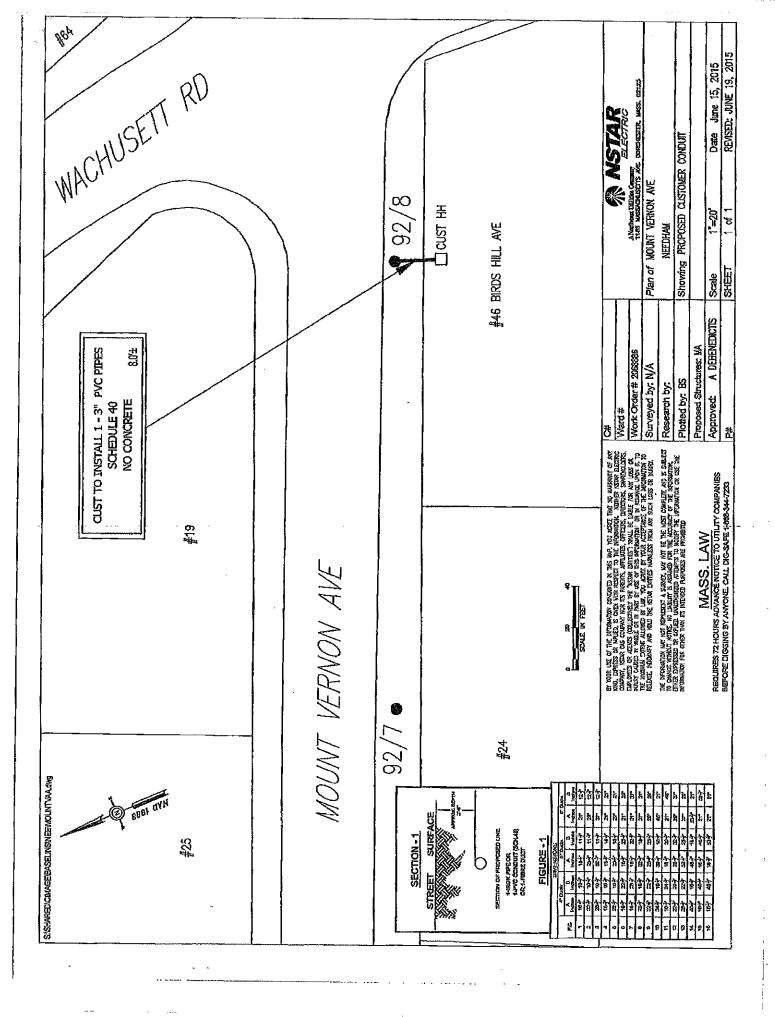

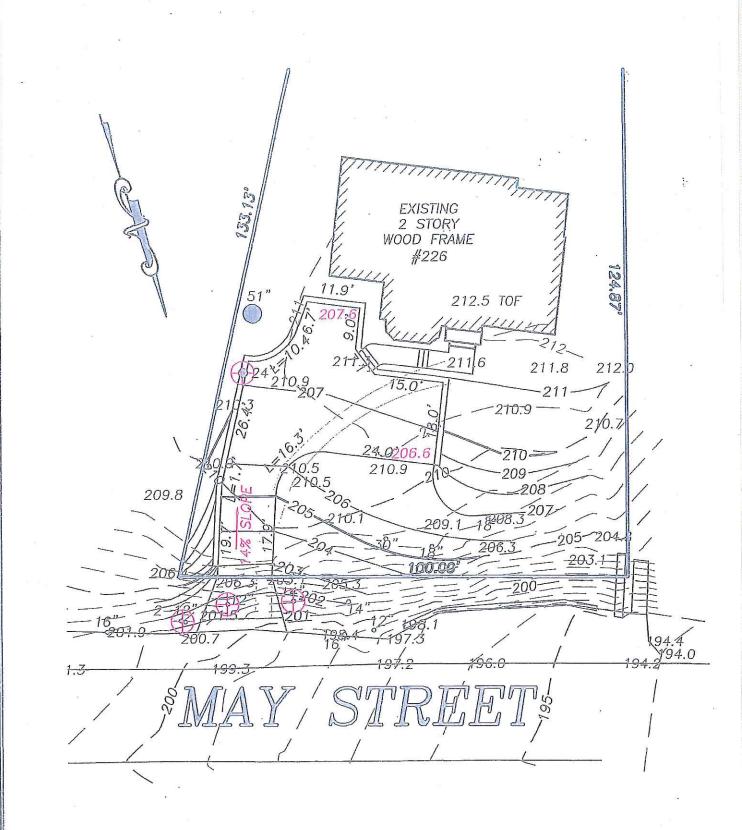

Sarah Kulke of 226 May St. has petitioned for the removal of three trees located on Town Property. Ms. Kulke is constructing a new driveway. The construction of the driveway would impact a Red Maple and two Black Birch trees on Town property. The trees are located within the Town layout and roadway. Since I found the trees in Fair condition, not a hazard to the public, a Public Shade Tree Hearing is required.

I feel Ms. Kulke is justified in her request seeking permission to remove these trees. I would ask the Selectmen to look favorably upon this request and vote to approve this tree removal.

In keeping with previous Town policy on the removal of live trees, and in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 87 Section 3, and after public hearing, I recommend granting permission for the removal of the 23" Black Birch, 14 "Red Maple and the 16" Black Birch trees. I further recommend that this tree is removed at the owner's expense by a contractor approved by the Town Of Needham. In addition I recommend that there be some sum of money paid to the Town Of Needham for future tree planting. At the most recent tree hearings the amount has been \$100 per tree removal.

I will work with the homeowner to see if there is adequate space for a tree replacement somewhere at this location.

MUNICIPAL DECLARATION OF RESTRICTION

Chris Kotsiopoulos, Individually, and as Trustee of Wayside Realty Trust, u/d/t dated July 1, 1998 recorded in the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds in Book 22616, Page 491, of 36 Rockwood Lane, Needham, Massachusetts, as the owner of the land described on Exhibit A attached hereto and having received approval of the Rockwood Lane Subdivision by the decision of the Needham Planning Board entitled Definitive Subdivision Decision, Rockwood Lane dated 24, 2015 recorded herewith (the "Decision") hereby imposes upon Lots 1 through 9, inclusive, and the Private Way (Rockwood Lane Extension) as shown on a plan entitled, "Rockwood Lane Subdivision" dated May 6, 2014, last revised April 24, 2015, prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., recorded in the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds as Plan No. _______ of 2015 in Book ______, Page ______" (hereinafter "Subdivision Plan") for the benefit of the Town of Needham and each owner or owners of Lots 1 through 9, as shown on the Subdivision Plan, their successors and assigns, in perpetuity the following conditions:

- 1. The waiver of street construction requirements, as fully set forth in paragraphs 1.a, 1.b, 1.c, 1.d, 1.e, 1.f, and 1.g of the Decision is expressly conditioned upon and subject to the restriction that neither the owner nor any successor owner or owners of Lot 1, Lot 2, Lot 3, Lot 4, Lot 5, Lot 6, Lot 7, Lot 8 or Lot 9, as shown on the Subdivision Plan (hereinafter referred to individually as a Lot or collectively as the Lots) shall use the Lots for any purpose other than single-family residential use or Lot owner home occupations as allowed under the Zoning By-Law, as shown on the Subdivision Plan, as approved by the Board and recorded herewith, and there shall be no further division of the Lots as shown thereon without the prior written approval of the Planning Board.
- 2. Each and every owner or owners of any Lot shall be jointly and severally responsible and liable, and shall fulfill all lot owners' obligations under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, for the costs of the maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the Private Way shown on the Subdivision Plan and designated thereon and all services, (whether the services are located within the Private Way or in areas shown partially on the Private Way and partially on a Lot), the installation of which are required in connection with this approval, or which may be installed at any time, including, without limitation, maintenance, repair and reconstruction of roadways, water, sewer and drainage facilities and other utilities and related equipment, curbs, monuments, sidewalks, landscaping and street signs, as and whenever necessary, and including all actions of any kind or nature necessary or appropriate in order to maintain the Private Way in a good, safe and passable condition, including snow plowing, providing access from each Lot to the public portion of Rockwood Lane, as shown on the Subdivision Plan, and providing adequate services to each Lot, all in accordance with these conditions. The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall maintain a dedicated capital reserve account having a minimum balance of \$10,000 to meet the obligations of this section.
- 3. Each and every owner or owners of any Lot shall be jointly and severally responsible and liable, and shall fulfill all Lot owners' obligations under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, for all maintenance, repairs and reconstruction required for or on the Private Way in compliance with and in conformity with requirements of the Town of Needham and

other requirements imposed by law or governmental authority. The within requirement shall be included in all deeds of the Lots.

- 4. The Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement and each owner of a Lot shall not use or permit use of the Private Way for any purpose other than ingress and egress from the Lots by the residents of the Lots and their guests and invitees, such use to be limited to pedestrian and private-passenger vehicular traffic, and such other vehicular traffic as is necessary from time to time in cases of emergency, delivery of customary and usual household services and equipment or in connection with the maintenance, repair or reconstruction of the Private Way, the Lot, and any structures thereon and services installed thereon, or hereunder.
- 5. No owner or owners of any Lot shall park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle on the Private Way. A no parking sign shall be posted on the turn-around stating "No Parking Emergency Vehicles Only".
- 6. Neither the Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement shall perform, nor shall they permit changes to be made to any Lot, which would impact the functionality or design of the drainage improvements as shown on the Plan, except in accordance with Condition 19 of the Decision.
- 7. Any and all maintenance, repair or reconstruction work performed on or to the Private Way or in connection with services installed thereon or hereunder by or at the direction of any owner or owners of any Lot or the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement as provided herein shall be carried out so as to ensure that no fill material nor any products or excavation or erosion resulting from or arising in connection with such work shall be discharged into any storm drainage system, and soil and other material or debris shall be removed from the site only if such removal will not impact the functionality or design of the drainage improvements shown on the Subdivision Plan, and only to the extent necessary in connection with such work.
- 8. No Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement shall at any time request that the Private Way be laid out or accepted as a public way in the Town of Needham unless such owner or owners or Trustees at its or their sole expense, perform and complete such work as is necessary to cause the Private Way to comply with all standards and regulations of the Town of Needham without waiver, and obtain all permits and approvals required by law in connection therewith. If the Private Way is accepted by the Town of Needham as a public way at any time, then the provisions hereof applicable to ownership and maintenance of the Private Way shall thereupon terminate.
- 9. No Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, shall at any time request or petition that any drainage system, water pipes, sewer pipes or related equipment or any other improvement within the subdivision for which design or improvement requirements have been waived by the Board as provided herein, be accepted or maintained by the Town of Needham.

- 10. The Town of Needham and its designees shall have the right to enter upon the Private Way for all purposes for which public ways are used in the Town of Needham.
- 11. In any sale or transfer by the owner or any successor owner of any of the Lots, the deed or other instrument shall refer to and incorporate conditions 3 through 12 inclusive and condition 15, of the Decision, and any conveyance shall include transfer of a fee interest or the perpetual right and easement to use the Private Way in common with others lawfully entitled thereto for all purposes for which public ways in the Town of Needham may now or hereafter be used consistent with the provisions hereof, and the subsurface areas, equipment and facilities used and maintained in connection with the provision of water, sewer, drainage and other utility services provided to the conveyed premises. Any deed or other instrument purporting to transfer or convey any interest in any Lot or Lots which does not expressly refer to and incorporate these conditions shall nevertheless be deemed to contain the same and in all events shall be subject thereto.
- 12. Every Lot owner of Lots 1 through 9, as shown on the Subdivision Plan, shall maintain and keep operational their respective roof runoff system and yard system in accordance with the Plan, as approved by the Decision, and as further described in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Report", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58 of the Decision) as revised by (Exhibit 87 of the Decision). Care shall be taken to retain the landscaping as shown on the Plan. The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall inspect the roof and yard systems once per calendar year shortly after a small rainstorm event to ensure proper operation and to ensure that the runoff from the entire roof area of the house system is draining into the roof system and where applicable, that runoff from the yard is draining into the yard system. Additionally, the landscaping, as shown on the Subdivision Plan, shall be inspected to assure compliance with the approved landscape plan. Systems shall be replaced/repaired by individual Lot owners as needed to ensure their continued operation in accordance with the Subdivision Plan and the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Report" (Exhibit 58) as revised by (Exhibit 87).
- 13. This Restrictive Covenant incorporating Conditions 3 through 12 and Condition 25 of the Decision will be recorded in the Registry of Deeds and shall run with the land.

This Restrictive Covenant shall be referenced on the Plan and shall be recorded therewith. This Restrictive Covenant shall be enforceable in perpetuity or for the longest period permitted by law and in any event for 100 years.

14. Enforcement: In the event that a breach of these restrictions by the Owner, or by the successors or assigns of the Owner, or by The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust, or by a third party under the control of the Owner, the Trust or any such successors or assigns, comes to the attention of the Town of Needham, the Town of Needham, acting through its Planning Board, may notify the Trust in writing of such a breach.

The Trust shall have sixty (60) days after receipt of such notice to undertake actions, including restoration of the restricted lots that are reasonably calculated to correct swiftly the

conditions constituting such a breach. If the Trust fails to take such corrective action within such time period, (or in the case of corrective actions requiring construction activities by the Trust, within such longer time period as is reasonable due to weather conditions, but in no event shall the time period exceed the greater of sixty (60) days after receipt of written notice as aforesaid or the June 1 next following the date of receipt of said notice) the Town of Needham may take appropriate legal proceedings, as are reasonably necessary to effect compliance with these restrictions and the town may recover its reasonable expenses, including expert fees, court costs and legal fees, which shall be paid by the Trust and/or the breaching party to the Town of Needham, provided the Trust and/or breaching party is determined to be responsible for the breach. If the Trust fails to pay for such restorations and reasonable expenses, etc., then the Town may recover such costs from each of the Lot Owners of record.

The rights hereby granted shall include the right to enforce this Municipal Declaration of Restrictive Covenants by appropriate legal proceedings and to obtain injunctive and other equitable relief and shall be in addition to, and not in limitation of, any other rights and remedies available to the Trust and the Town of Needham.

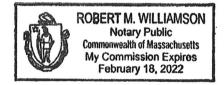

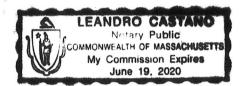

The approval herein granted is based on the Plan entitled, "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Rockwood Lane, Needham, Massachusetts", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, Radner Design Associates, Inc., 945 Concord Street, Suite 100, Framingham, MA 01701, consisting of eighteen (18) Sheets; Sheet No. 1, Cover Sheet, entitled "Definitive Subdivision Plan, Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Needham, Massachusetts", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014, September 26, 2014, October 31, 2014 and December 18, 2014; Sheet No. 2, Sheet EX-1.1, entitled "Existing Conditions Plan", dated May 6, 2014; Sheet No. 3, entitled "Subdivision Plan of Land", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014; Sheet 4, Sheet CS-1.1, entitled "Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014 and August 22, 2014; Sheet No. 5, Sheet CE-1.1, entitled "Site Layout Plan", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014; Sheet No. 6, Sheet CE-1.1a, entitled "Site Layout Plan," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014; Sheet No. 7, Sheet CE-2.1, entitled "Site Grading Plan", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014 and August 22, 2014; Sheet No. 8, Sheet CE-2.1a, entitled "Site Grading Plan", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014 and August 22, 2014; Sheet No. 9, Sheet CE-3.1, entitled "Site Utilities Plan", dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014; Sheet No. 10, Sheet CE-3.1a, entitled "Site Utilities Plan," dated May 6. 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014. - 1. The Board hereby waives compliance with the following requirements of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, having found that such action is in the public interest and is not inconsistent with the intent and purposes of the Subdivision Control Law.
- a) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all streets be laid out to a width of 50 feet and approves instead a 40-foot wide right-of-way, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the

provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board acknowledged that the existing right-of-way width for the public portion of Rockwood Lane is 40 feet and that an extension of the private portion of Rockwood Lane at a 40 foot right-of-way width was appropriate. Additionally, the Board found a right-of-way width of 40 feet to be sufficient to accommodate the 9 lot residential subdivision.

- b) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all streets be paved to a width of 24 feet and approves instead a pavement width of 20 feet, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board acknowledged that the existing pavement width for the public portion of Rockwood Lane is 20 feet and that an extension of the private portion of Rockwood Lane at a pavement width of 20 feet was appropriate. Additionally, the Board found a pavement width of 20 feet to be sufficient to accommodate the 9 lot residential subdivision.
- c) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that the maximum grade of a street not exceed eight percent, and approves instead an eight and one-half percent (8.5%) grade at the locale of the new roadway connection to the existing Rockwood Lane pavement for a distance not to exceed 100 feet, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered the unique topographic features of the land as shown on the Plan.
- d) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.16 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require the construction of a sidewalk in accordance with the "Standard Specifications" of the Town of Needham along both sides of Rockwood Lane and approves instead a walkway on only one side of the street, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered that by means of limiting the amount of impervious surface on the site the objective that the drainage system design would be adequate to serve the needs of the 9 residential lots would be addressed so as to minimize off-site drainage impacts on neighboring properties.
- e) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.5 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all cul-de-sacs have a minimum radius of 60 feet and approves instead a hammerhead, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered the Plan and the specific goal of minimizing tree removal at the rear of Lot 6 and Lot 7 which would otherwise be required if a 60 foot radius diameter circle turnaround was to be required.
- f) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.6.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all streets be constructed in accordance with the standard street cross-section and approves instead the cross-section as shown on the Plan, showing a 20-foot pavement width, a sidewalk along one side of the roadway and a uniform cross slope towards one side of the roadway instead of a crowned cross section. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered all matters described in sections 1.a, 1.b, 1.c, 1.d and 1.e above.

- g) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.6 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that bituminous concrete berms be installed along both sides of the roadway at the edge of pavement in a continuous manner and waives the requirement for the placement of cape cod berm along the west side of the proposed roadway, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered the need to allow the drainage on the west side of the roadway to flow unimpeded to the swale located east of the roadway as shown on the Plan.
- 2. Petitioner shall cause the Plan and documents to be revised to show the following additional or revised information which modifications shall be subject to review and approval of the Board prior to endorsement of the Plan:
- a) The Plan shall be revised to show a speed bump at the juncture of the private portion of Rockwood Lane with the public portion of Rockwood Lane and which is located entirely on the private portion. Said speed pump shall be installed if the Petitioner is unable to secure approval for a stop sign at the intersection of Rockwood Lane and Richard Road as further described in paragraph 29 of this Decision. In the event that a speed bump is required, as noted herein, it shall be installed at the time the final coat of pavement is laid on the new roadway.
- b) The "Rockwood Lane Subdivision Construction Period Pollution Prevention Plan and Erosion Control Operation and Maintenance Plan", dated July 2014 and comprising a portion of the "Stormwater Management Hydrology Calculations, Rockwood Lane Subdivision, 36 Rockwood Lane, Needham, MA", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014 (Exhibit 21), shall be revised to incorporate the recommendations of the Town of Needham Engineering Department as detailed in Exhibit 87.
- c) The Plan shall be revised to include a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan and further revised to provide for the timely installation of erosion control measures.
- 3. The waiver of street construction requirements, as fully set forth in paragraphs 1.a, 1.b, 1.c, 1.d, 1.e, 1.f, and 1.g is expressly conditioned upon and subject to the restriction that neither the owner nor any successor owner or owners of Lot 1, Lot 2, Lot 3, Lot 4, Lot 5, Lot 6, Lot 7, Lot 8 or Lot 9 as shown on the Plan (hereinafter referred to individually as a Lot or collectively as the Lots) shall use the Lots for any purpose other than single-family residential use or Lot owner home occupations as allowed under the Zoning By-Law, as shown on the Plan, as approved by the Board and recorded herewith, and there shall be no further division of the Lots as shown thereon without the prior written approval of the Planning Board.
- 4. Each and every owner or owners of any Lot shall be jointly and severally responsible and liable, and shall fulfill all lot owners' obligations under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, for the costs of the maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the Private Way shown on the Plan and designated thereon and all services, (whether the services are located within the Private Way or in areas shown partially on the Private Way and partially on a Lot), the installation of which are required in connection with this approval, or which may be installed at any time, including, without limitation, maintenance, repair and reconstruction of roadways, water, sewer and drainage facilities and other utilities and related equipment, curbs, monuments, sidewalks, landscaping and street signs, as and whenever necessary, and including all actions of any kind or nature necessary or appropriate in order to maintain the Private Way in a good, safe and passable condition, including snow plowing, providing access from each Lot to the public

portion of Rockwood Lane, as shown on the Plan, and providing adequate services to each Lot, all in accordance with these conditions. The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall maintain a dedicated capital reserve account having a minimum balance of \$10,000 to meet the obligations of this section.

- 5. Each and every owner or owners of any Lot shall be jointly and severally responsible and liable, and shall fulfill all Lot owners' obligations under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, for all maintenance, repairs and reconstruction required for or on the Private Way in compliance with and in conformity with requirements of the Town of Needham and other requirements imposed by law or governmental authority. The within requirement shall be included in all deeds of the Lots.
- 6. The Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement and each owner of a Lot shall not use or permit use of the Private Way for any purpose other than ingress and egress from the Lots by the residents of the Lots and their guests and invitees, such use to be limited to pedestrian and private-passenger vehicular traffic, and such other vehicular traffic as is necessary from time to time in cases of emergency, delivery of customary and usual household services and equipment or in connection with the maintenance, repair or reconstruction of the Private Way, the Lot, and any structures thereon and services installed thereon, or hereunder.
- 7. No owner or owners of any Lot shall park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle on the Private Way. A no parking sign shall be posted on the turn-around abutting Lot 6 stating "No Parking Emergency Vehicles Only".
- 8. Neither the Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement shall perform, nor shall they permit changes to be made to any Lot, which would impact the functionality or design of the drainage improvements as shown on the Plan.
- 9. Any and all maintenance, repair or reconstruction work performed on or to the Private Way or in connection with services installed thereon or hereunder by or at the direction of any owner or owners of any Lot or the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement as provided herein shall be carried out so as to ensure that no fill material nor any products or excavation or erosion resulting from or arising in connection with such work shall be discharged into any storm drainage system, and soil and other material or debris shall be removed from the site only if such removal will not impact the functionality or design of the drainage improvements shown on the Plan, and only to the extent necessary in connection with such work.
- 10. No Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement shall at any time request that the Private Way be laid out or accepted as a public way in the Town of Needham unless such owner or owners or Trustees at its or their sole expense, perform and complete such work as is necessary to cause the Private Way to comply with all standards and regulations of the Town of Needham without waiver, and obtain all permits and approvals required by law in connection therewith. If the Private Way is accepted by the Town of Needham as a public way at any time, then the provisions hereof applicable to ownership and maintenance of the Private Way shall thereupon terminate.
- 11. No Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, shall at any time request or petition that any drainage system, water pipes, sewer pipes or related equipment or any other improvement within the subdivision for which design or improvement requirements have been waived by the Board as provided herein, be accepted or maintained by the Town of Needham.

- 12. The Town of Needham and its designees shall have the right to enter upon the Private Way for all purposes for which public ways are used in the Town of Needham.
- 13. In any sale or transfer by the owner or any successor owner of any of the Lots, the deed or other instrument shall refer to and incorporate conditions 3 through 12 inclusive and condition 15, and any conveyance shall include transfer of a fee interest or the perpetual right and easement to use the Private Way in common with others lawfully entitled thereto for all purposes for which public ways in the Town of Needham may now or hereafter be used consistent with the provisions hereof, and the subsurface areas, equipment and facilities used and maintained in connection with the provision of water, sewer, drainage and other utility services provided to the conveyed premises. Any deed or other instrument purporting to transfer or convey any interest in any Lot or Lots which does not expressly refer to and incorporate these conditions shall nevertheless be deemed to contain the same and in all events shall be subject thereto.
- 14. The Petitioner shall deliver to the Board a Restrictive Covenant incorporating conditions 3 through 12 inclusive and condition 15 of this Decision in a form suitable for recording in the Registry of Deeds that shall run with the land and shall be enforceable by the Town. Such restriction shall be referenced on the Plan and shall be recorded therewith. Said covenant shall be enforceable in perpetuity or for the longest period permitted by law and in any event for 100 years.
- 15. The Petitioner shall grant a 13-foot wide pedestrian access easement to the Town of Needham as a condition of this approval. The pedestrian access easement as shown on the Plan generally runs over the westerly edge of Lot 6. The 13-foot access easement is to be used by members of the public for walking and as access to Town of Needham property to the north of the subdivision. Gatherings, parties, use of alcoholic beverages or drugs are strictly prohibited. The easement shall only be available between the hours of dawn and dusk. No structures are to be placed within the 13-foot easement area nor are any other improvements permitted which would impede or obstruct the passage of pedestrian access. In accordance with the provisions of MGL Chapter 21, Section 17C, the Petitioner, his successors and assigns shall not be liable for personal injuries or property damage sustained by such members of the public, including without limitation a minor, while on said land resulting from the grant of said easement, in the absence of willful, wanton, or reckless conduct by said Petitioner. Such access shall not confer upon any member of the public using said land, including without limitation a minor, the status of an invitee or licensee to whom any duty would be owed by said Petitioner. In addition to the abovenoted 13-foot pedestrian access easement, the Petitioner shall provide a pedestrian access easement across the entirety of the Private Way to be used by members of the public for walking and as pedestrian access to Town of Needham property to the north of the subdivision. Parking of motor vehicles by members of the public shall not be permitted on the Private Way.

It shall not be the responsibility of the Petitioner, and it shall not be a condition precedent to the relief and permissions granted by this Decision, or the construction of the subdivision and sale of Lots, for Petitioner to obtain the acceptance of said easements by the Town of Needham, provided that the Petitioner shall obtain the subordination or partial release of all mortgages or monetary liens encumbering the easement areas and shall deliver same with the easements(s). The Petitioner shall record the noted easements and shall provide an attorney's certification stating that as of the date of the recording of the easement, the Town has a good and clear record and marketable easement.

- 16. In any sale or transfer by the record owner of Lot 6, as shown on the Plan, or any successor record owner of title to Lot 6, as shown on the Plan, the deed or other instrument shall refer to and incorporate by reference condition 15 of this Decision. Any deed or other instrument purporting to transfer or convey any interest in Lot 6 which does not expressly refer to and incorporate condition 15 shall, nevertheless, be deemed to contain the same and all events shall be subject thereto.
- 17. Street lighting shall be provided in the subdivision in accordance with the Plan. The light sources shall be on posts at least 10 feet high and shall be controlled by photovoltaic switches. Post lighting shall be supplied as shown on the Plan. The lighting system shall be maintained and the electricity shall be supplied by the Lot owners, and each Lot owner shall fulfill all Lot owner obligations relating thereto under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement.
- 18. The Lot owners and the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall maintain the landscape vegetation within the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" and the Private Way in accordance with the Plan entitled, "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Needham, Massachusetts", prepared by Radner Design Associates, Inc., 945 Concord Street, Suite 100, Framingham, MA 01701: Sheet L1, entitled "Landscape Plan," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014, September 26, 2014, October 31, 2014 and December 18, 2014; Sheet L2, entitled "Planting Details," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014; and Sheet L3, entitled "Landscape Details," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014. There shall be no further changes to the landscape approach as depicted on the above-noted plans, which formed the basis of the findings of fact upon which the drainage system design was derived and approved, except as otherwise provided in paragraph 19.
- 19. There shall be no alteration or change to a Lot so as to effect the drainage system for any Lot, or the drainage systems running across a Lot, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision, without the prior written approval of the Planning Board or Town Engineer as noted below. Any Lot owner who proposes to make a change from the approved Plan shall first file a copy of a plan depicting the proposed changes with the Needham Town Engineer, with a request for a determination as to whether the changes affect the drainage system. If the Town Engineer determines that the changes affect the drainage system, or if the Town Engineer fails to respond to the request for a determination within 45 days, the Lot owner may file the plan with the Planning Board for its review. In such event, the Lot owner shall file with the Planning Board such information as the Planning Board determines necessary for its review. The Planning Board shall hold a public hearing within 60 days of receiving a complete filing. After said public hearing, the Board may, in its sole discretion, find that the proposed changes do not appear to negatively impact down gradient property owners or interfere with the functioning of the drainage system(s) of the Lot or subdivision. In such event the Lot owner, only upon receipt of a written decision from the Planning Board, may implement the changes as shown on the new plan.
- 20. The Town of Needham shall have the authority with respect to any emergency as relates to the maintenance of the drainage system, to enter and make necessary repairs in order to abate said emergency. Emergency shall be defined as the creation of a condition that results or could result in flooding of adjacent properties, the overloading of the municipal drainage system or the creation of a condition that is injurious to the public health or safety. Within thirty days of invoice by the Town all costs incurred by the Town of Needham in the event of such emergency shall be paid by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust, and if not paid within said thirty days, then such costs shall be assessed against all the Lot owners and shall become a lien on all the Lots in the subdivision which may be collected and enforced in the manner fixed by law for

the collection of taxes. All costs shall include, but shall not be limited to, the cost of materials and the salary costs for all employees involved with the emergency actions. Notice of lien shall be recorded in the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds.

- 21. Off-street drainage surety in the amount of \$31,500.00 shall be posted (\$3,500.00 per lot) prior to the release of Lots 1-9 inclusive as shown on the Plan for purposes of building or conveyance. As recommended in the memo of the Board of Health dated May 28, 2014, all lots shall be graded to the limits of construction so as to have no standing water and/or otherwise create a public health nuisance. Grading shall not improperly shed or illegally increase drainage onto adjacent properties. All subsequent developers or builders shall be notified of the off-street drainage bond and the specific off-street drainage requirements. If required by the Board of Health, an as-built certified grading plan(s) of all or any of the lots shall be submitted prior to release of the drainage surety.
- 22. In order to maximize the continued effectiveness of Stormwater Management Best Management Practices for the Rockwood Lane Subdivision, the operations and maintenance requirements as outlined in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87) shall apply to all stormwater facilities within the development. The stormwater facilities are depicted on the Plan and are hereinafter referred to as the "Stormwater Facilities". Operations and maintenance tasks shall be commenced once each respective stormwater facility is fully constructed and is receiving runoff from the new roadway system or house.
- 23. Prior to subdivision bond release, commencement of the operations and maintenance obligations by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust and/or Petitioner shall be on a Lot by Lot basis and shall commence once each individual stormwater facility construction is substantially complete. Each transfer of operational control to the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall be documented by a letter to the Planning Board and Department of Public Works indicating the stormwater facilities which are substantially complete and transferred to the Trust for operation and maintenance. The Petitioner shall be responsible for the completion of construction of any stormwater management facilities in accordance with the approved permits and plans.

After subdivision bond release and after completion of the stormwater facilities on a particular Lot, as evidenced by release of the Planning Board bond for the associated items, the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall be responsible for all operations and maintenance requirements for the stormwater facilities within the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" and within the Private Way along with any future construction or repair of the stormwater facility. Roof runoff infiltration systems and yard run-off systems located outside of the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" shall be the responsibility of the owner of each Lot.

- 24. Operations and Maintenance Tasks shall be completed in accordance with the Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary, prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87).
- 25. Every Lot owner of Lots 1 through 9, as shown on the Plan, shall maintain and keep operational their respective roof runoff system and yard system in accordance with the Plan, as

approved by this Decision, and as further described in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87). Gutters and downspouts shall be maintained in good working order at all times. Care shall be taken to retain the landscaping as shown on the Plan. Any shrubs that die shall be replaced by the Lot owner. The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall inspect the roof and yard systems once per calendar year shortly after a small rainstorm event to ensure proper operation and to ensure that the runoff from the entire roof area of the house system is draining into the roof system and where applicable, that runoff from the yard is draining into the yard system. Additionally, the landscaping, as shown on the Plan, shall be inspected to assure compliance with the approved landscape plan. Systems shall be replaced/repaired by individual Lot owners as needed to ensure their continued operation in accordance with the Plan and the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary" (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87).

- 26. Except for the individual house roof and yard systems noted in paragraphs 23 and 25 above, which shall be the responsibility of the owner of the Lot on which said system resides, the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall be responsible for all future costs and work associated with the reconstruction or replacement of any of the facilities noted on the Plan or in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary" (Exhibit 58), as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87), as being the responsibility of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust to maintain. Such facilities include: (a) All stormwater facilities located within the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement".
- 27. The following information shall be submitted by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust no later than December 31st of each calendar year to the Town of Needham Department of Public Works, Planning Board and Board of Health to assure compliance with the Operations and Maintenance Plan: (a) An updated list of which types of roof and yard systems each lot within the development has employed for use by future inspectors of said systems; (b) statement, signed by an authorized representative of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust indicating that the requirements of the Operations and Maintenance Plan were performed during the previous calendar year, provided that where requirements were not met, a schedule for their completion shall be provided and a follow-up statement submitted when complete; (c) list of the maintenance activities performed along with the approximate date of the work; (d) list of the inspections performed along with a statement by each inspector summarizing the results of the inspections performed in accordance with the approved Operations and Maintenance Plan; (e) copies of appurtenant documentation supporting the completion of the Operations and Maintenance responsibilities such as copies of contracts and/or receipts with parties engaged to perform maintenance and inspection services; (f) notation regarding whether there has been any change in the name or contact information for the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust. Additionally, relevant information reasonably requested by the Planning Board shall be provided by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust.
- 28. The Petitioner has submitted a letter (Exhibit 59) which provides a list of actions that will be taken to address the NPDES Stormwater Phase II requirements: Control Measure #1- "Public Education and Outreach" and Control Measure #2, "Public Participation/Involvement". Petitioner shall implement said measures as proposed prior to the release of the subdivision lots.

- 29. The Petitioner shall review placement of a stop sign at the intersection of Rockwood Lane and Richard Road with the Town of Needham Traffic Management Advisory Committee and if approved by said Committee shall coordinate its installation with the Department of Public Works.
- The Planning Board has determined that the project's scale, complexity and potential impacts warrants the use of outside consultants (such as engineers) to ensure compliance with the approved subdivision plan and all other relevant laws and regulations. Such assistance shall include, but shall not be limited to, monitoring or inspecting the project site for compliance with the Board's decisions or regulations and inspecting the project during construction and implementation. Accordingly, following approval of the definitive subdivision plan and before actual construction begins, the Petitioner shall provide a detailed work program and associated work schedule for project construction and implementation to the Director of Public Works. The noted work program and schedule shall provide the basis for determining the initial Project Inspection Fee required hereunder. The Project Inspection Fee as estimated by the Needham Department of Public Works and approved by the Planning Board shall be provided by the Petitioner for deposit in an account established pursuant to G.L. c. 44, s. 53G (53G Account). No work shall commence on the subdivision until the fee has been paid in full. Should the balance in the required 53G account fall below 25% of the initial Project Inspection Fee, as noted above, the Planning Board may require the Petitioner to provide a supplemental Project Inspection Fee to cover the cost of the remaining inspection process.
- 31. The Petitioner shall follow the Construction Minimization and Mitigation measures outlined in the Construction Minimization and Mitigation Measures Plan (Exhibit 86). Mitigation measures shall include, but are not limited to: (1) use of blasting as the preferred form of ledge and rock removal, to reduce or eliminate the need for hoe rams (generally used for ledge and subsurface rock removal during site development), rock drills and pile drivers, as well as rock crushing devices (hereinafter "Impact Devices"); (2) sufficient drill hole density at the blast site to minimize large boulders that would require subsequent hoe ramming to process such boulders into smaller rocks. Boulders resulting from blasting shall not be processed into smaller rocks at the site but shall be removed to an appropriate site outside of Needham for this purpose. Additionally, rock crushing activities shall not be permitted at the site but shall only be conducted at an appropriate location outside of Needham. The Petitioner shall establish a 24-hour construction hotline to investigate and resolve all noise complaints to the satisfaction of the Planning Board. The name of the construction supervisor and contact information shall be mailed to the abutting residents prior to the start of site construction.
- 32. A schedule indicating days and hours of all planned use of Impact Devices, if required, shall be developed and provided to the Building Commissioner, Town Engineer, Board of Health Director and Planning Board at least one week before any such planned activity. A daily log shall be kept for the length of the project recording the days and hours of the use of specific Impact Devices. Non-compliance with the Construction Minimization and Mitigation Measures Plan and the conditions of this Decision may result in the issuance of cease and desist orders by the Building Commissioner, to be enforced by the Police Department as necessary.
- 33. The Petitioner shall follow the Rockwood Lane Subdivision Construction Period Pollution Prevention Plan and Erosion Control Operation and Maintenance Plan, dated July 2014. (Exhibit 68 as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer as detailed in Exhibit 87).
- 34. The Petitioner shall follow the Rockwood Lane Landscape Operations and Maintenance Plan, undated (Exhibit 39) and the 2015 Landscape Maintenance Proposal, prepared by Labadini

Corporation, 355 Boston Post Road West, Marlborough, MA 01752, dated August 19, 2014 (Exhibit 38).

- 35. Following approval of the definitive subdivision plan and before actual construction begins the Petitioner shall meet with the Director of Public Works and his staff. The Petitioner is urged to bring his engineer, roadway contractor and lot developers to this pre-construction meeting. Any problems contemplated in the construction phase, as well as inspection status, contact persons, etc. will be discussed, as well as procedures to be followed. A summary of said meeting, as prepared by the Department of Public Works Director, shall be initialed by himself and the Petitioner and forwarded to the Director of Planning and Community Development.
- 36. A Construction Access Plan shall be submitted for approval by the Needham Police Chief and if so approved shall be submitted to the Needham Building Inspector for approval. Said plan shall show proposed truck delivery routes to and from Route 128 to the subject site and authorized delivery times for enforcement purposes. Not intended for inclusion in the Construction Access Plan are passenger vehicles, pick-up trucks and panel trucks all with a maximum weight of three (3) tons. No construction shall begin until the Construction Access Plan has been approved. All contractors, subcontractors and vendors shall be contractually required to agree to the requirements of the Construction Access Plan to work on this project. The Petitioner shall post signs on-site regarding approved truck delivery routes and authorized delivery times for enforcement purposes. On school days, construction traffic shall be eliminated to the subdivision, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m., and between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. On early release days, construction traffic shall be eliminated to the subdivision, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m., and between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 12:30 p.m.
- 37. The following safeguards shall be implemented during construction:
- a. The hours of construction and construction related activities shall be limited to 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
- b. The Petitioner's contractor shall designate a person who shall be responsible for the construction process. That person shall be identified to the Police Department, the Department of Public Works, the Building Inspector and the abutters and shall be contacted if problems arise during the construction process. The designee shall also be responsible for assuring that truck traffic and the delivery of construction material does not interfere with or endanger traffic flow on Rockwood Lane. The designee shall supply a phone number where the designee can be reached 24 hours per day.
- c. The Petitioner shall take appropriate steps to minimize, to the maximum extent feasible, dust generated by the construction, including, but not limited to, requiring subcontractors to place covers over open trucks transporting construction debris or materials to or from the site and keeping Rockwood Lane clean of dirt and debris and watering appropriate portions of the construction site from time to time as may be necessary.
- d. The Petitioner shall install and maintain a tire tracking pad for trucks leaving the site before they enter onto the public portion of Rockwood Lane.
- 38. All trees having a caliper of 6 inches as measured three feet off the ground bordering "Rockwood Lane" and on the site shall be retained and not disturbed or destroyed during

construction of the subdivision except for those trees which must be removed for the construction of the proposed way, driveways, utilities, and dwellings and uses accessory thereto.

- 39. Prior to site alteration the Petitioner shall mark in the field those trees which the landscape plan indicates will be retained. Such trees identified to be preserved shall be distinguished with appropriate markings, which may include surrounding fences or stakes. Any such trees removed which were identified for retention shall be replaced with trees of similar quality and caliper or as otherwise approved by the Board.
- 40. A Department of Environmental Protection sewer extension and connection permit may be required to service the subdivision and abutting lots. If required, approval of this subdivision is subject to the granting by the Board of Selectmen and the Department of Environmental Protection of a Sewer Extension and Connection Permit.
- 41. Any and all special permits required by the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority shall be obtained at the expense of the Petitioner.
- 42. A special sewer connection permit program fee shall be paid for all lots within the subdivision.
- 43. Grade adjustment rings are not permitted to adjust gate boxes and/or other castings. The Petitioner shall use appropriately sized castings.
- 44. All catch basins shall remain functional at all times. Rims shall be set at binder elevation and shall be adjusted to finish course elevation prior to placement of the top course of pavement.
- 45. If the binder course of pavement is exposed to one winter season, it shall be chipsealed prior to September I of the following winter season. If the roadway work is not completed prior to the third winter season, road reconstruction may be required by the Highway Superintendent.
- 46. During initial construction, no openings to the chipseal shall be made between the months of November 30 and April 1 prior to the placement of the top course of pavement.
- 47. The construction, operation and maintenance of the subdivision shall be conducted in accordance with the EPA's Memorandum of Understanding signed by the Board of Selectmen.
- 48. "As-built" construction plans of the sewer, water and drainage utilities shall be submitted to the Department of Public Works and the Planning Board for review and approval prior to release of the respective performance bond amounts.
- 49. All future sewer tie-ins to properties located outside of this subdivision shall be accomplished in a manner consistent with the "Town of Needham Master Plan of Connection to the MWRA Sewer" dated January 8, 1988, (as revised) and prepared by the Needham Public Works, Sewer Division.
- 50. Prior to the commencement of any street construction within the subdivision, the location of future street lighting, location of fire alarm circuits and outlets, and the location of underground power to serve these shall be shown on an amended version of the definitive utility plan to be filed with the Board and Public Works Department.

- 51. The provisions of M.G.L., Chapter 131, Section 40 and 40A and the Needham Wetlands Protection By-Law shall be satisfied.
- 52. All construction staging and parking shall be on-site. No parking of any vehicles related to the construction shall be permitted on Richard Road, the public portion of Rockwood Lane, or on any other public street.
- 53. All areas where utilities are proposed shall be compacted to the satisfaction of the Public Works Department.
- 54. In the absence of any details or waivers set forth herein, the current Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board shall govern and are hereby made a part of this Decision. All construction details not specifically shown on the approved Plan shall conform to Department of Public Works specifications.
- 55. The developer is directed to submit the Subdivision Inspection Form during all phases of construction as required, in accordance with Appendix E of the Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board.
- 56. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, the Petitioner shall have two years from the date of endorsement of the Plan to complete the installation and construction of Rockwood Lane, and the services provided therein, in accordance with the applicable Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board. Failure to so complete shall automatically rescind approval of the Subdivision Plan unless an extension is otherwise granted by the Planning Board.
- 57. The Petitioner shall enter a written agreement to guarantee completion, once commenced, of the required improvements for all Lots in the Subdivision, as shown on the Plan, with such construction and installation to be additionally secured by one of the methods delineated under the provisions of Section 3.5.1. Such agreement shall be subject to review and approval of the Planning Board prior to endorsement of the Plan.
- 58. The Petitioner has delivered to the Planning Board for its review and approval an easement deed to the Town of Needham granting to the Town the right to pass on foot or by vehicle over the Private Way, and over the "13-foot Wide Access Easement" on Lot 6 and access rights over the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" on each of the Lots (Exhibit 67), a Declaration of Restrictions (Exhibit 67), and Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement (Exhibit 88) ("the Documents"). The Petitioner shall finalize the Documents to address the requirements of this Decision and of Town Counsel and shall submit the Documents to the Planning Board for final review and approval of the Board prior to endorsement of the Plan. The Petitioner shall deliver to the Planning Board for its review and approval a duly executed Subdivision Covenant and a duly executed Restrictive Covenant, in a form approved by the Board and incorporating the conditions of this Decision, (the "Covenants"). The Covenants and Documents shall be referenced on the Plan and all documents shall be recorded with the Plan.
- 59. Prior to the release of any lots for building or sale, copies of the recorded instruments described in paragraphs 14, 15, 16, and 58 of this Decision and copies of the recorded plan shall be provided to the Planning Director. Prior to the release of Lot 6 copies of the recorded instruments described in paragraph 15 of this Decision shall be provided to the Planning Director.

60. The Petitioner shall present the Plan to the Board for proper endorsement within ninety (90) days of the date this Decision is executed unless such time period is extended, in writing, by the Board. The Board reserves the right to rescind its approval if said Plan is not presented to the Board for endorsement within the time period herein specified. Further, the Petitioner or his authorized representative shall submit the Plan to the Planning Director fourteen (14) days in advance of its scheduled presentation to the Planning Board to allow adequate time to review the revised Plan for compliance with the conditions of this Decision.

The foregoing have been stated for the purpose of emphasizing their importance and are not intended to be all inclusive or to negate any provision of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board.

Under the provisions of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board and Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, Sections 81-K through 81-GG, inclusive, the Board shall have the power to modify or amend the terms and conditions of this approval after due notice on the application of the owner, lessee or mortgagee of the premises or upon its own motion. All the provisions of the Subdivision Control Law applicable to approval shall, where appropriate, is applicable to such modification or amendment. Such power is hereby reserved. Appeals, if any, shall be made pursuant to Section 81-BB of the Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, and shall be filed within twenty (20) days after the date of filing this Decision with the Town Clerk.

The provisions of this Approval and Conditions shall be binding upon every owner or owners of each of the lots, as shown on the Plan, and the executors, administrators, heirs, successors and assigns of such owners, and the obligations and restrictions herein set forth shall run with said land in full force and effect for the benefit of and enforceable by the Town of Needham. Reference to this Approval shall be entered upon the Plan and this Approval shall be recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds with the Plan. The Lot Owner agrees to reimburse the Town for its reasonable costs in connection with the enforcement of and/or the correction of violations of the conditions of this permit. Counsel for the Petitioner shall certify to the Town that this approval and all easement and restrictive covenants required hereunder have been recorded and are effective record encumbrances upon the subject property.

DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIONS

Chris Kotsiopoulos, Individually, and as Trustee of Wayside Realty Trust, u/d/t dated July 1, 1998 recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds in Book 22616 Page 491, of 36 Rockwood Lane, Needham, Massachusetts (the "Declarant"), as the owner of the land described on Exhibit A attached hereto, hereby makes and declares that the nine lots shown as Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, (the "Lots) on a plan entitled "Rockwood Lane Subdivision" prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc. dated May 6, 2014, last revised through April 24, 2015, (the "Plans"), which plans were endorsed by the Needham Planning Board on May 26, 2015 and which plans are recorded herewith shall be subject to the following covenants and provisions:

I. Restrictions

- a. No buildings, or other structures other than one (1) single family dwelling house with accessory buildings normally found in the residential districts in the Town of Needham or walls as depicted on the Plan shall be constructed, placed or maintained on any Lot shown on the Plan.
- b. No industrial, commercial, residential (other than single family residential use or Lot Owner home occupation, as allowed under the Needham Zoning By-Law), recreational nor farming uses shall occur on the Lots, excepting such accessory business and residential activities permitted by the Zoning By-Laws of the Town of Needham;
- c. No earth materials including soil, loam, peat, sand, rock, minerals, gravel nor clay shall be excavated, removed from, or moved about on the Lots except in connection with approved "future improvements" as hereinafter defined.
- d. All single family dwellings to be constructed on any Lot shall have at least 3800 square feet of living space exclusive of garages, breezeways, attics and accessory structures.
- e. The grounds of each Lot shall be maintained by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust (the "Trust"), which Trust is recorded herewith as Instrument Number in Book , Page , in a neat and attractive manner, free of dead trees, dead shrubs and dead plants, in accordance with the maintenance responsibilities set forth on Exhibit B ("Landscape Operations and Maintenance Plan November, 2014") attached hereto. Except during initial or subsequent construction (but excluding normal grounds maintenance), no living trees or shrubs shall be removed from any building lot without prior written approval of the Approval Authority. In the event the Trust fails to so maintain the grounds, the Lot Owner may, at its option, and after giving seven (7) days' notice to the Trust by registered mail sent to the Trust, maintain the property and remove dead trees, dead shrubs, and dead plants. Trash,

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debris and garbage shall be removed by the Lot Owner to maintain the property in a neat and attractive manner.

- f. Every Lot Owner shall maintain the exterior of any structures in good repair and appearance. The Trust may, after six (6) months' written notice sent to a Lot Owner at the address of the owner, enter upon said property as often as it is necessary in its sole discretion to make repairs and improve the appearance in a reasonable and workmanlike manner, all of the foregoing without being guilty of trespass. The Lot Owner shall reimburse the Trust for the cost of any work required by this Declaration, and, to secure the payment of same, the Trust shall have a lien upon such building lot enforceable as hereinafter provided.
- g. No Lot Owner shall allow or place, maintain or store any commercial vehicle not also used for personal use, unregistered motor vehicle of any type, motorcycle or other two or three wheel motor vehicles of any description overnight on any land described on Exhibit A unless parked in a garage or other approved structure.
- h. No Lot Owner shall place any garbage or other refuse containers on any lot unless enclosed and placed in such a manner so as not to be visible from the roadways or adjacent lots except in connection with normal pickup and collection of same.
- i. No Lot Owner shall place or erect any radio or television towers or other appurtenant structures upon any building lot, nor erect any antenna device exceeding a height of six (6) feet.
- j. No Lot Owner shall keep, maintain or raise on any building or Lot any cows, hogs, goats or similar animal or animals other than domesticated house pets (e.g., dogs and cats); nor shall any chicken yard or similar facility be placed or maintained thereon.
- k. No Lot Owner shall install or maintain exterior lighting of such intensity that unreasonably disturbs any resident nor shall any Lot owner install or maintain any exterior clothes line.
- 1. No Lot Owner shall alter the exterior materials or colors of any structure whether a residential dwelling or accessory building without the approval of the Approval Authority.
- m. In any sale or transfer by the Owner or any successor owner or owners of any of the Lots, the deed or other instrument shall refer to and incorporate conditions 3 through 13 inclusive and condition 25 of the Decision of the Needham Planning Board entitled Definitive Subdivision Decision, Rockwood Lane dated April 24, 2015 recorded herewith (the "Decision"), and any conveyance shall include transfer of a fee interest or the perpetual right and easement to use the Private Way in common with others lawfully entitled thereto for all purposes for which public ways in the

Town of Needham may now or hereafter be used consistent with the provisions hereof, and the subsurface areas, equipment, and facilities, used and maintained in connection with the provision of water, sewer, drainage and other utility services provided to the conveyed premises. Any deed or other instrument purporting to transfer or convey any interest in any Lot or Lots which does not expressly refer to and incorporate these conditions shall, nevertheless, be deemed to contain the same and shall be subject thereto. It shall be the responsibility of each owner to maintain and keep operational their respective roof drainage systems, in accordance with the Plan and the provisions of Section 25 of the Decision.

- n. No Lot Owner shall alter the drainage system, including the cultec systems, undergrounding piping, swales, grading, roof drains and any and all pies and structures (the "Drainage System") for any Lot as shown on the Plans approved by the Town of Needham Planning Board (copy attached as Exhibit C, Plans entitled, "Rockwood Lane Subdivision" prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc. dated May 6, 2014 last revised April 24, 2014 endorsed by the Planning Board on May 26, 2015 (The "Approved Plans")) without the approval of the Approval Authority and the Town of Needham Planning Board as set forth in the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust dated July , 2015, and recorded herewith, this Declaration and the Decision of the Planning Board dated February 24, 2015 and recorded herewith.
- o. Every Lot Owner shall maintain the exterior lighting depicted on the Approved Plans on his/her Lot.
- The Lot Owner shall not change or alter the lot, change the grading on the Lot, p. change the impervious coverage on the Lot or change landscaping to include species outside of the approved pallet as shown on the Plans, so as to impact the functioning or design of the Drainage System as depicted on the Approved Plans. In the event the Trust determines that a Lot Owner has altered the Drainage System without the approval of the Town of Needham as set forth herein, the Trust shall have the rights, as set forth in the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust. Any Lot Owner in addition to obtaining the approval of the Approval Authority as set forth herein, who proposes to make changes in the property, shall file a copy of the Plan depicting the changes with the Needham Town Engineer, who shall review the plan to determine whether the changes affect the Drainage System. If the Town Engineer determines that the changes do affect the Drainage System, he shall set forth that opinion in writing. In the event that the Town Engineer determines that the changes affect the Drainage System, then the Lot Owner may file the Plan with the Planning Board for its review and approval. The Lot Owner shall file with the Planning Board such information as the Planning Board determines necessary for its review. After a public hearing, the Planning Board may in its sole discretion, determine that the changes although changes to the Drainage System do not negatively impact down gradient property owners. In such event only the Lot Owner, upon receipt of a written decision from the Planning Board, and upon the approval of the Approval

Authority may implement the new plan. No changes may be implemented without the approval of the Town Engineer in instances where the Town Engineer determines that the changes do not affect the Drainage System or the Planning Board in instances where the changes do affect the Drainage System but the Planning Board approves the changes.

q. The Lot Owner shall clean and maintain the roof gutters on a timely and regular basis, to insure proper flow to the Drainage System. Roof gutters/System shall be replaced/repaired by individual Lot Owners as needed to ensure continued operation in accordance with these Restrictions. In the event the Lot Owner fails to clean and maintain the roof gutters, the Trust shall have the right to perform the cleaning and maintenance of the gutters and the Trust shall have the right to collect the cost thereof and lien the property as set forth in the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust.

II. Approval

- a. No buildings, fences, driveways, sidewalks, swimming pools, tennis courts, basketball courts or parking areas or other structures of any kind or additions thereto (hereinafter called collectively "future improvements") shall be erected, placed, or allowed to stand upon any Lot, nor shall the grade of any portion of any Lot or the exterior material or colors of any structures be changed until the size, plans, specifications, colors, materials and locations of any "future improvements" thereon and until the particular use of such future improvements or in the case of grading, the proposed final grading shall have been approved in writing or this restriction waived with respect thereto or released in writing by the Approval Authority as provided for herein.
- In approving or disapproving a particular "future improvement", the change of any b. exterior material or color of any structure or the grading of any Lot, the Approval Authority shall limit its consideration to whether or not the construction of such improvement, change in exterior material or color, or change in grading would have a material adverse impact on the marketability, development, use, enjoyment, or salability of the Lot and the Lots within the Subdivision, the Drainage System (as defined in the Homeowners Association Trust and shown on the Approved Plan), or any applicable requirement of the Definitive Subdivision Decision, or the Covenant, taking into consideration the architectural style and design, engineering considerations and the quality and type of proposed exterior materials and colors. The construction of approved "future improvements" on any Lot once begun shall be carried forward to completion with due diligence; and any improvement not substantially completed within one year after it is begun shall be removed; provided that said one year period shall be extended to the extent of any periods during which construction operations are prevented by governmental regulations, strikes, or casualties, it being understood that as used herein "substantial completion" shall mean that the exterior of the building has been fully completed and the building site

has been graded, paved, and landscaped so as to give the outward appearance that the building and the building site have been completed. In no event shall any use be made of any Lot, which is otherwise prohibited by the By-Laws of the Town of Needham, as the same may from time to time be amended, or by any applicable law, ordinance, or regulation of any governmental unit having jurisdiction thereof.

- c. The term "Approval Authority" as used herein shall mean the Trustees of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust.
- d. All decisions by the Approval Authority hereunder, after the term of the Initial Trustee shall be by majority vote.
- e. The Approval Authority Members shall receive no compensation for their services.
- f. Except with respect to approvals pursuant to Sections I (n), (o) and (p) above, any approval of the Approval Authority required pursuant to this Declaration shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.

III. Benefit

The provisions contained herein shall run with the land and shall bind the owners of the Lots and their heirs, devisees, legal representatives, successors and assigns.

IV. Enforcement

Any owner of a Lot may prosecute proceedings at law against any person violating or attempting to violate the provisions hereof either to restrain violation or to recover damages. The Town of Needham shall have the right to prosecute proceedings against any person violating or attempting to violate Sections I.n.,p. or q.

V. <u>Administrative Provisions</u>

a. The provisions of this Declaration may be modified, amended or revoked, in whole or part, during the period of the Trustees control of the Approval Authority by a written instrument executed by the Declarant (added in very first para.) and duly recorded at the Norfolk District Registry of Deeds. After transfer of the Approval Authority from the Initial Trustee, this Declaration may be modified only at any annual or special meeting of the Lot Owners by the affirmative vote of seventy-five (75%) percent in interest of the Lot Owners. No amendment to this Declaration or to the By-Laws by the Trustees that would change, alter, or in any way affect the Trust's Obligations to maintain Rockwood Lane, the Drainage System(s) or the Landscape Elements or alter the Town of Needham's rights, as more fully described in the Trust, shall be effective unless and until the Planning Board of the Town of Needham agrees in writing to such change.

- b. All notices and requests directed to the Declarant shall be addressed to Rockwood Estates, LLC, 85 Franklin Street, Needham, Massachusetts 02492, or to such other address as may hereinafter be designated by the Declarant and notices directed to a Lot Owner shall be addressed to the Lot or to any address designated by such Lot Owner in writing.
- c. The title headings are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference, and in no way are, or are they intended to be, a part of this Declaration or in any way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of the particular section or clause to which they refer.
- d. If any easement, covenant, restriction, or agreement herein contained shall be held invalid by any court of proper jurisdiction, such invalidity shall in no way affect any other easement, covenant, restriction, or agreement herein contained.
- e. A certificate signed by the Declarant relating to compliance with the covenants, restrictions, and agreements as required by the Declaration shall be conclusive evidence against all persons of the truth of the facts therein stated.
- f. The term "Declarant" shall mean, where appropriate, the Declarant, the Trustees, or their respective successors or assigns. Where appropriate, references in the singular shall mean in the plural and references to the male gender shall, where appropriate, mean the female gender.
- g. Unless expressly qualified herein, the term "grantee" shall mean a lot owner or land owner, his or her heirs, successors and assigns and/or his or her agent, servants, tenants or other person or persons for whom the grantee has a legal responsibility.
- h. No provision in this within Declaration is intended to be in violation or derogation of any town by-law or ordinance or state statute or law. In the event of a conflict, the law shall prevail. In the event of any alleged ambiguity involving the provisions of the within Declaration, the more restrictive interpretation shall be applicable.

VI. Non-Waiver [We cannot delete this as it provides for specific rights to enforce. I added language if your concern was about the town.]

The failure of any owner of a Lot or any party which has rights to enforce these restrictions to enforce any restriction, covenant, or provision hereof, shall not be deemed to be a waiver of the right to do so thereafter as to the same breach or to one occurring prior or subsequent thereto.

VII. Duration

The restrictive covenants set forth herein shall continue in perpetuity or for the longest period allowed by law and in any event for 100 years and shall be included in each and every deed of the Lots shown on the Plans.

VIII. Acceptance

By the acceptance of a deed of a lot in the Rockwood Estates Subdivision, each Lot Owner accepts and agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of this Declaration, the Definitive Subdivision Decision, Rockwood Lane, dated February 24, 2015, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith ("Definitive Subdivision Decision"), the Subdivision Covenant Under the Provisions of General Laws, Chapter 4, Section 81-U dated July , 2015, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith ("Covenant") the Trust and the Grant of Access Easement Agreement, dated July , 2015, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith (the "Easement"). Each Lot Owner further agrees to allow the Trust and the Town of Needham to enter upon the property to inspect and perform any maintenance or repairs as described in the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant, the Easement and the Trust.

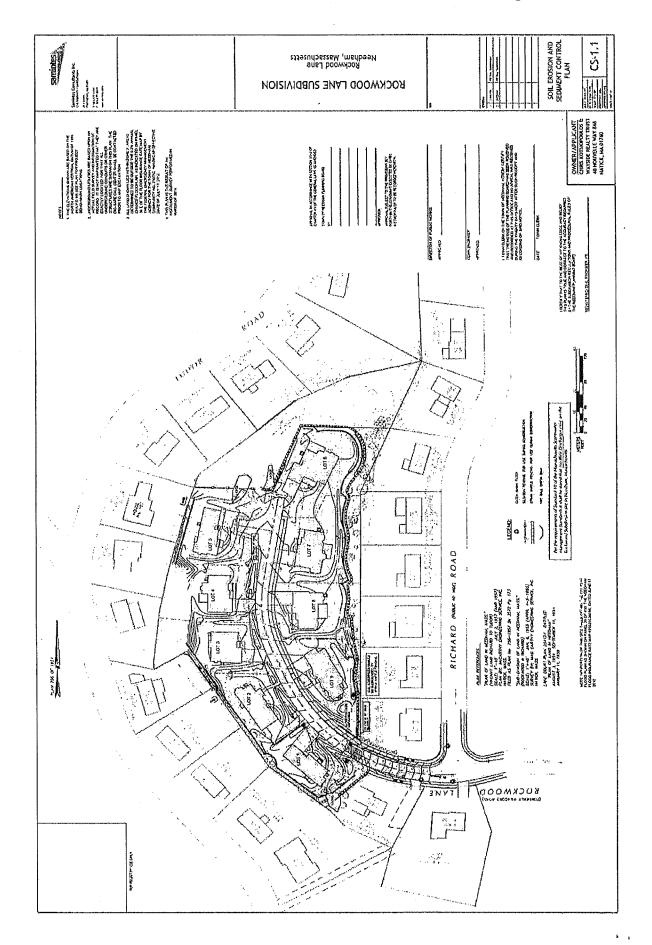
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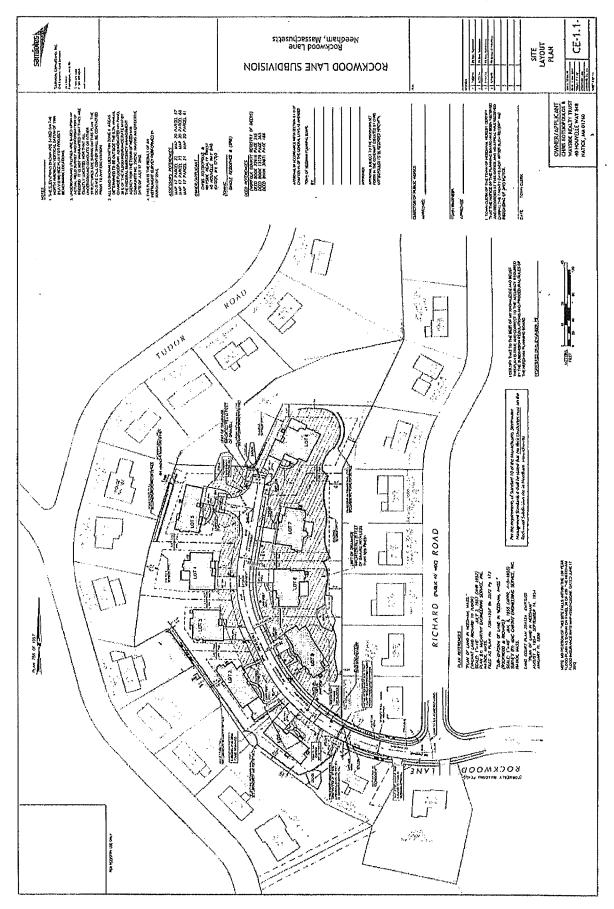
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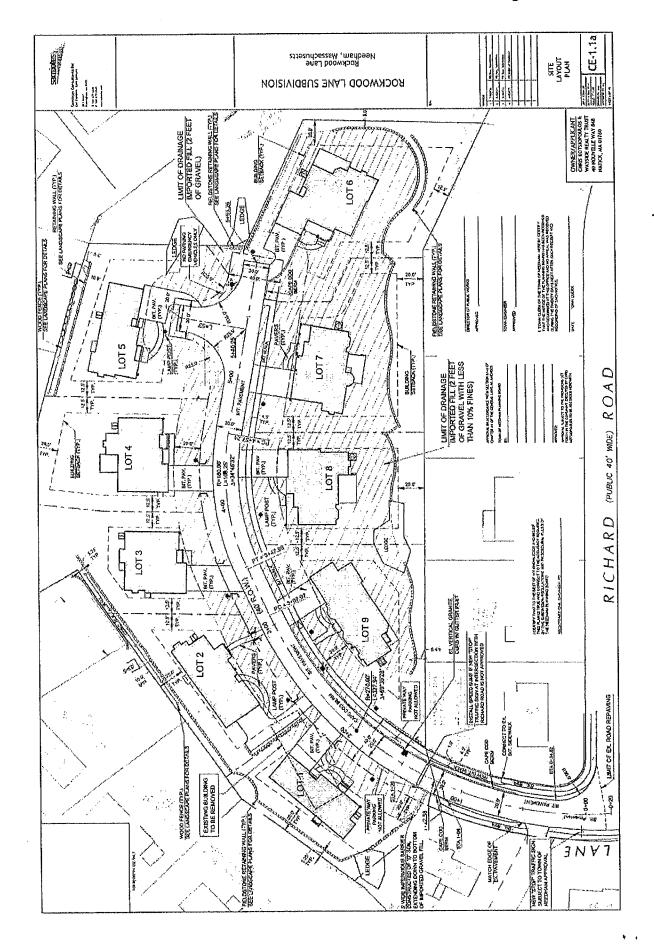


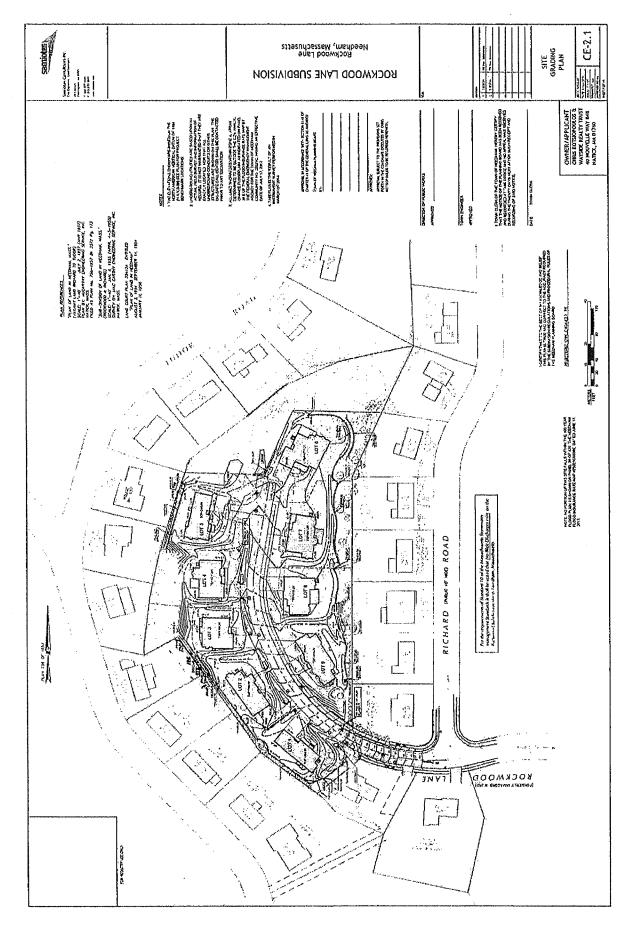
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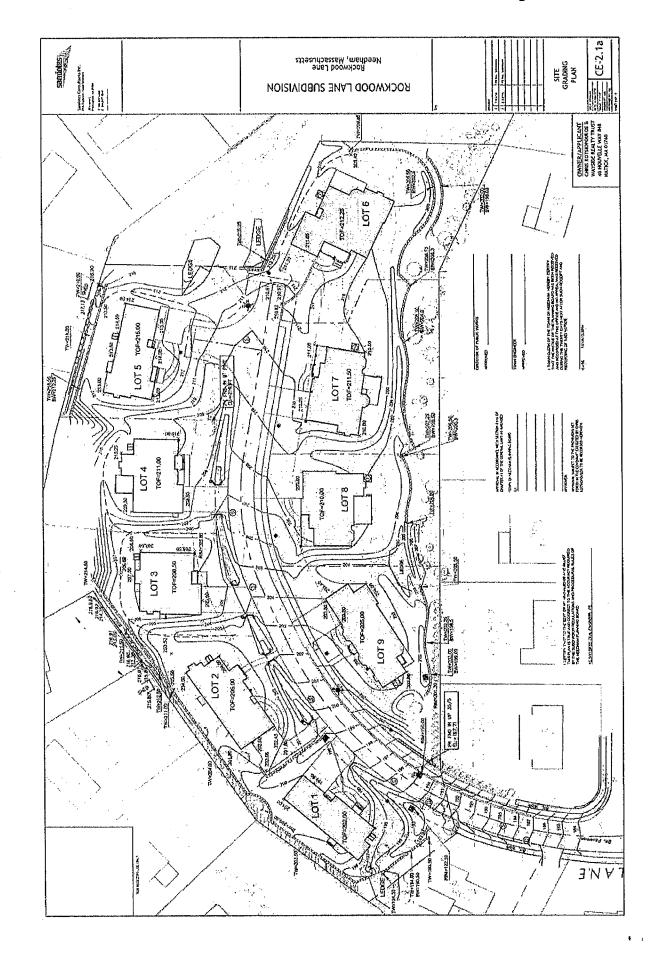


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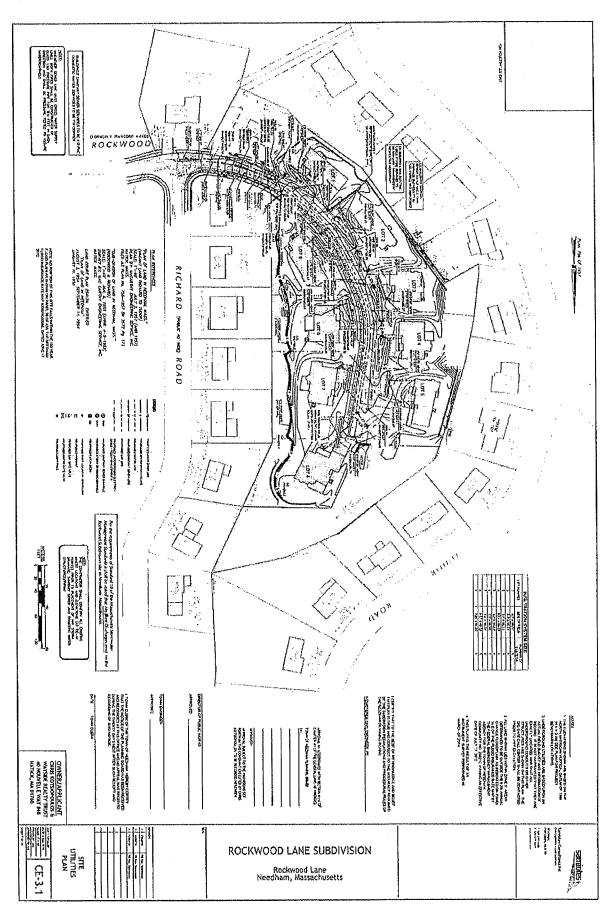




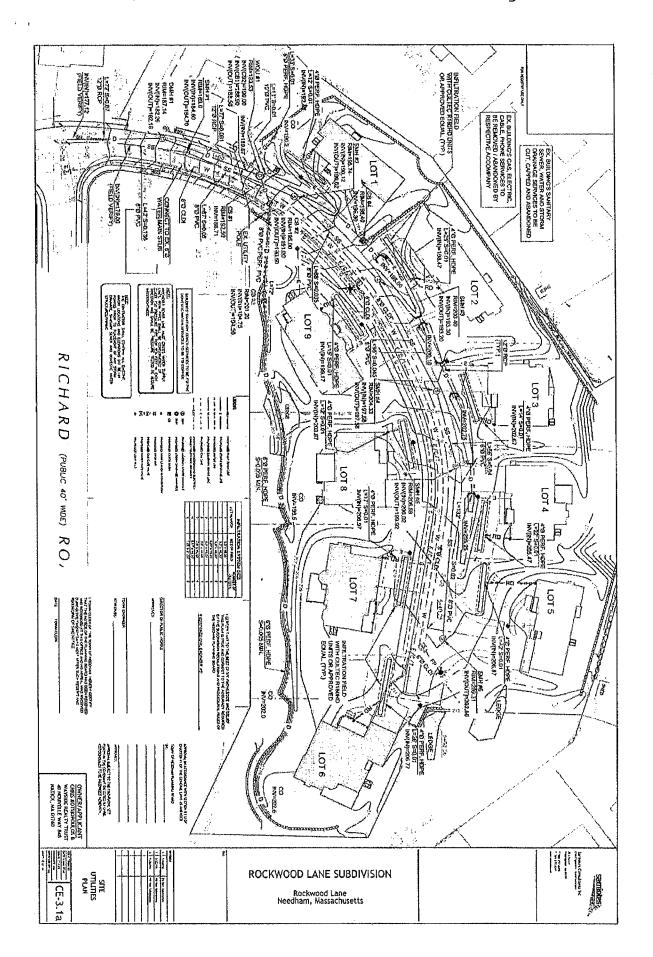
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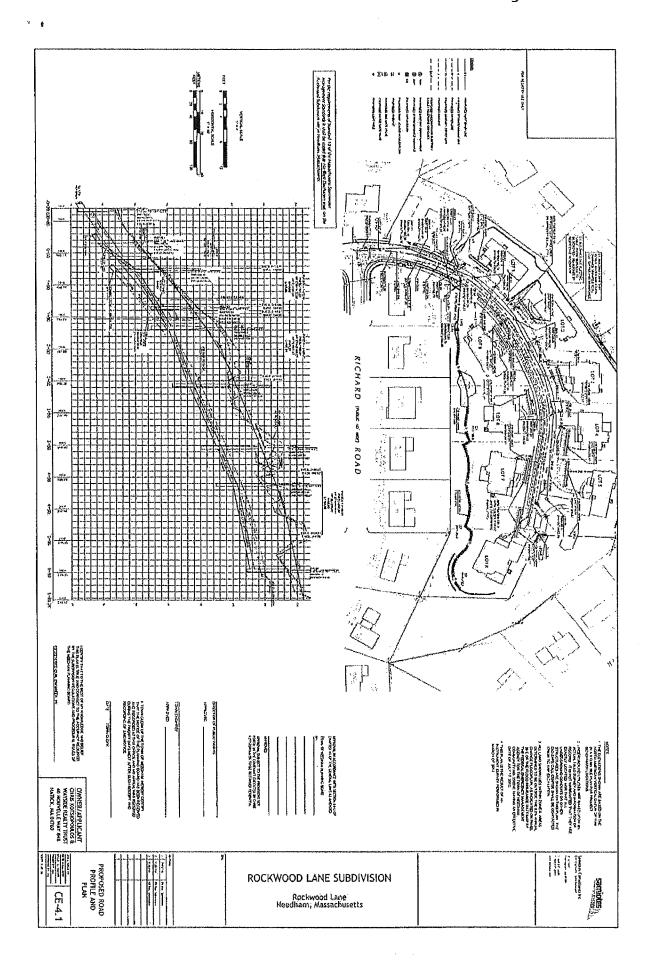


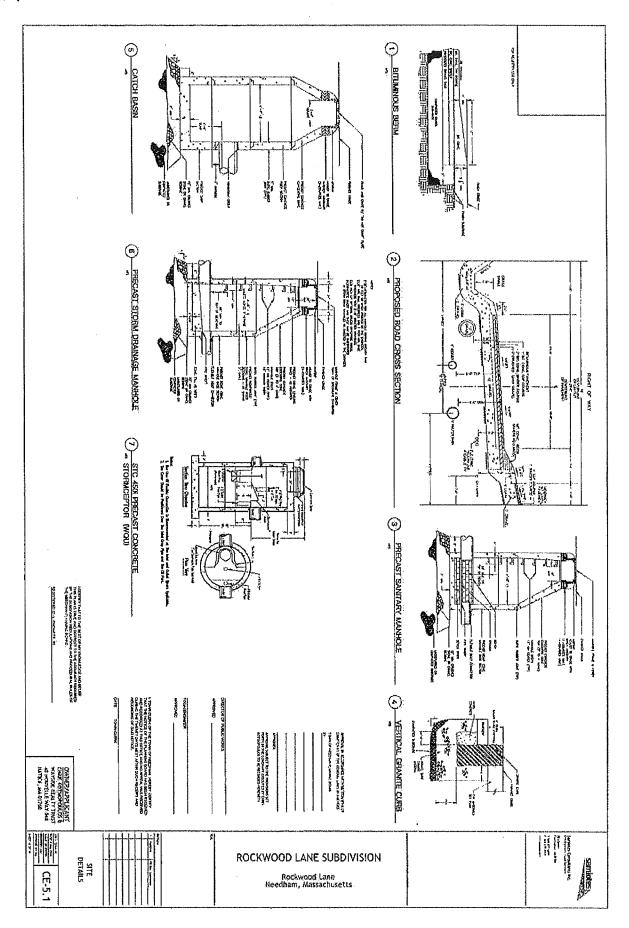
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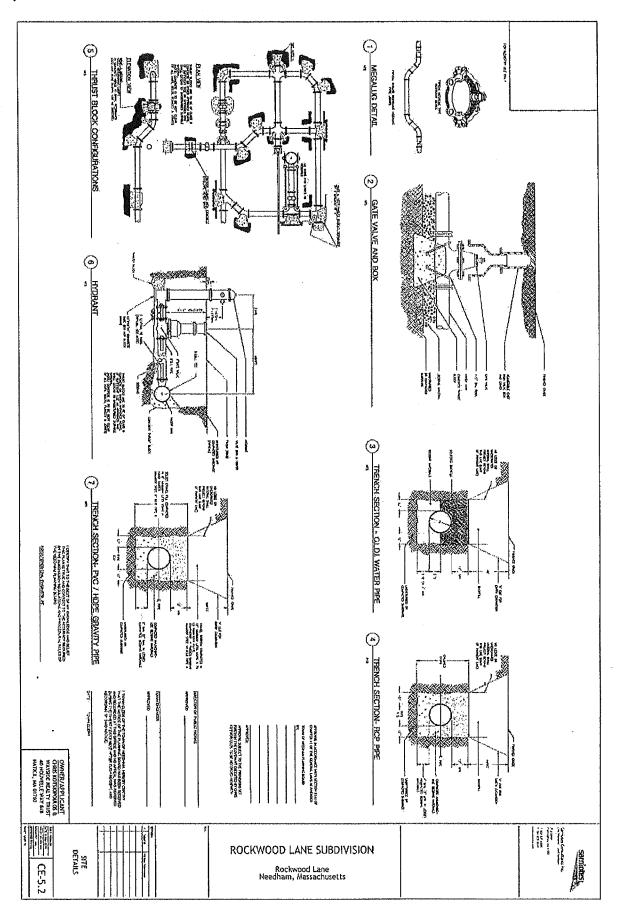
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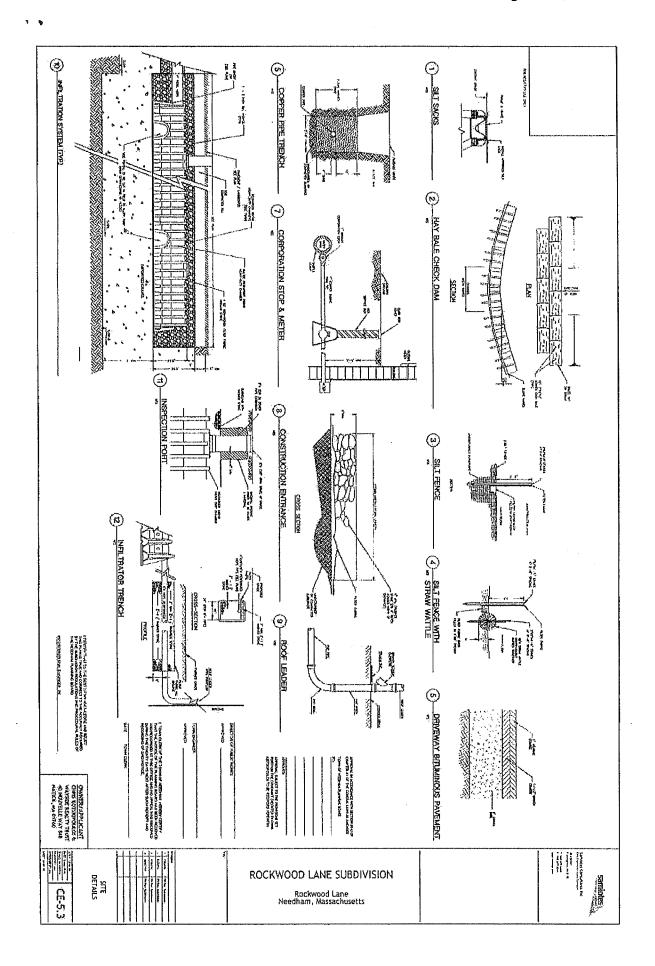


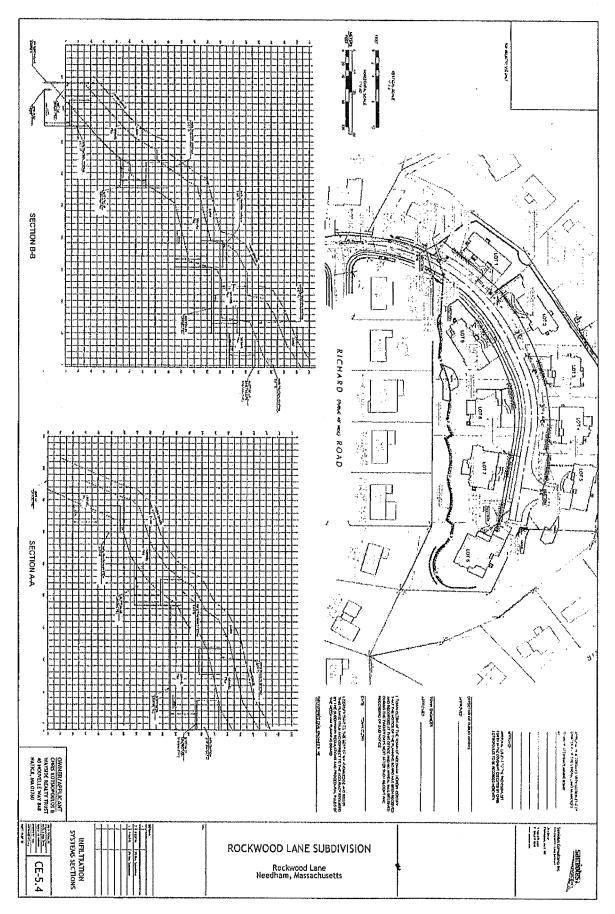


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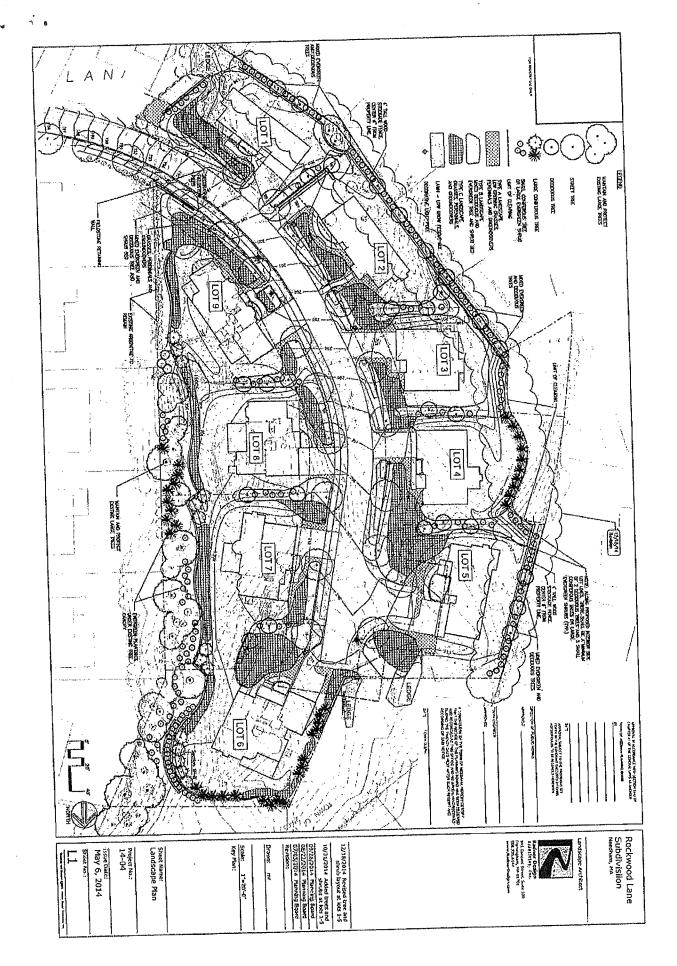


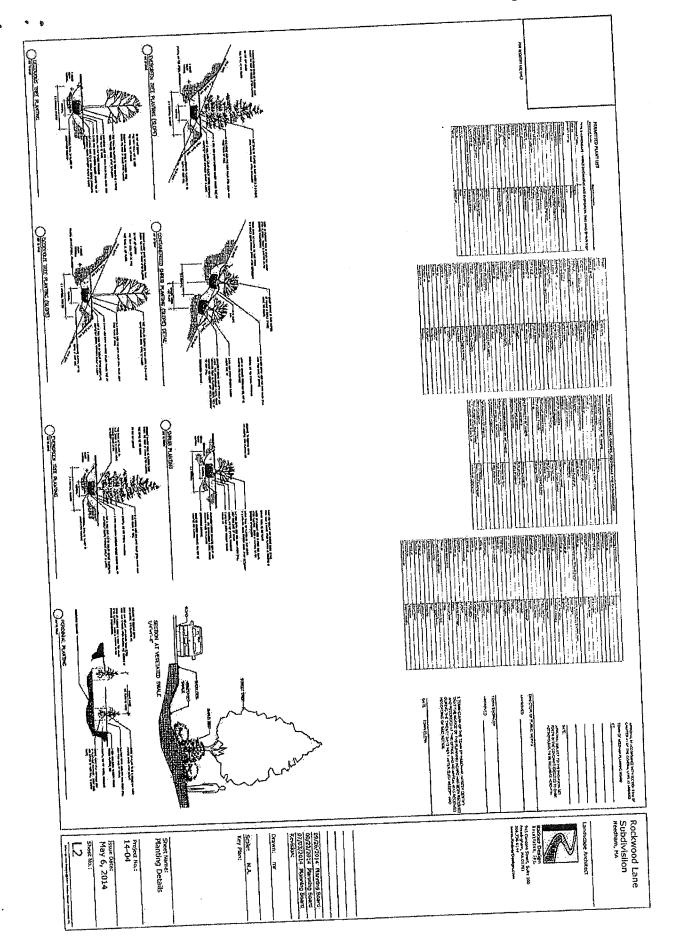
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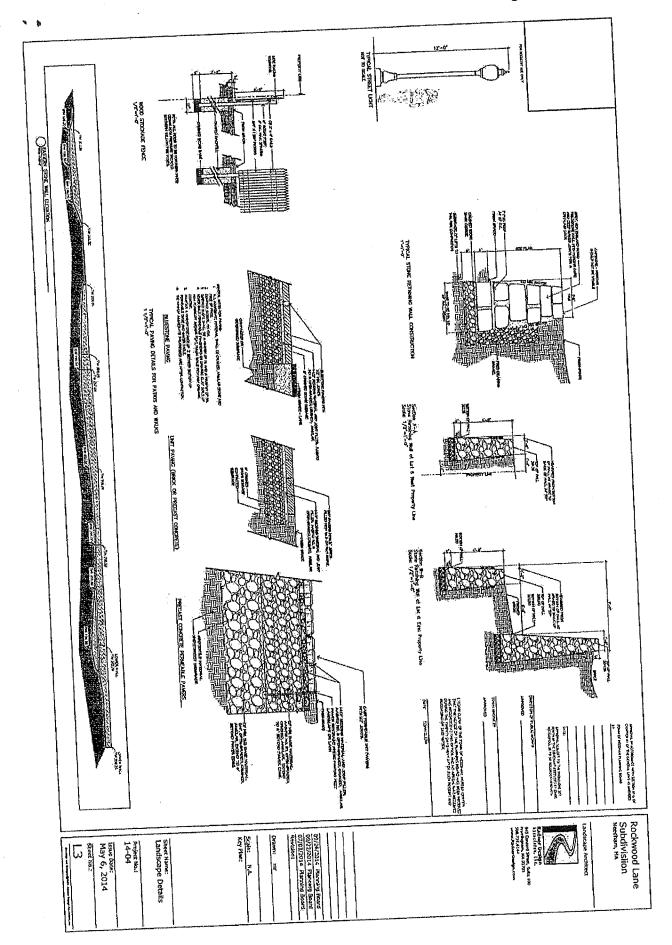


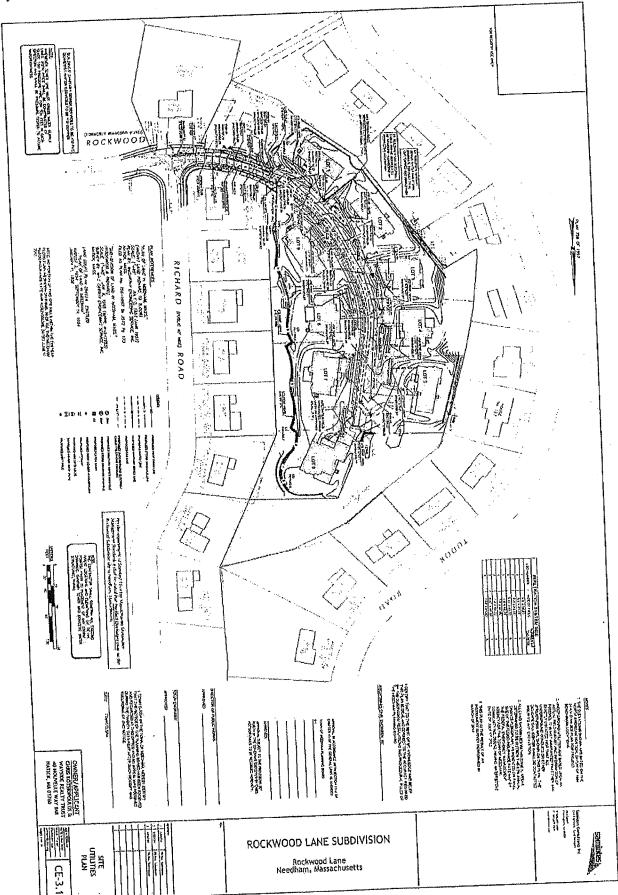


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60. The Petitioner shall present the Plan to the Board for proper endorsement within ninety (90) days of the date this Decision is executed unless such time period is extended, in writing, by the Board. The Board reserves the right to rescind its approval if said Plan is not presented to the Board for endorsement within the time period herein specified. Further, the Petitioner or his authorized representative shall submit the Plan to the Planning Director fourteen (14) days in advance of its scheduled presentation to the Planning Board to allow adequate time to review the revised Plan for compliance with the conditions of this Decision.

The foregoing have been stated for the purpose of emphasizing their importance and are not intended to be all inclusive or to negate any provision of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board.

Under the provisions of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board and Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, Sections 81-K through 81-GG, inclusive, the Board shall have the power to modify or amend the terms and conditions of this approval after due notice on the application of the owner, lessee or mortgagee of the premises or upon its own motion. All the provisions of the Subdivision Control Law applicable to approval shall, where appropriate, is applicable to such modification or amendment. Such power is hereby reserved. Appeals, if any, shall be made pursuant to Section 81-BB of the Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, and shall be filed within twenty (20) days after the date of filing this Decision with the Town Clerk.

The provisions of this Approval and Conditions shall be binding upon every owner or owners of each of the lots, as shown on the Plan, and the executors, administrators, heirs, successors and assigns of such owners, and the obligations and restrictions herein set forth shall run with said land in full force and effect for the benefit of and enforceable by the Town of Needham. Reference to this Approval shall be entered upon the Plan and this Approval shall be recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds with the Plan. The Lot Owner agrees to reimburse the Town for its reasonable costs in connection with the enforcement of and/or the correction of violations of the conditions of this permit. DECLARATION OF TRUST ROCKWOOD ESTATES HOMEOWNERS TRUST

Declaration of Trust is made this ______ day of _______, 2015, Chris Kotsiopoulos, Individually, and as Trustee of Wayside Realty Trust, u/d/t dated July 1, 1998 recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds in Book 22616 Page 491, of 36 Rockwood Lane, Needham, Massachusetts, being the owner of the premises located off Rockwood Lane, Needham, Massachusetts, which premises comprise the Rockwood Lane Subdivision ("Subdivision"), as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto.

- 1. <u>Name of Trust</u>. The name of this Trust shall be the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust ("Trust"). The Trust is created as an organization of homeowners, "Owners" as defined in Section 4 hereof, for the purpose of taking title to and/or managing the private ways, drainage improvements, utilities and easements as shown on the Plans referenced in Exhibit A (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Plans").
- 2. <u>Initial Trustees</u>. The Initial Trustee of this Trust shall be Steven Venincasa, 85 Franklin Street, Needham, Massachusetts 02492. He, or his successor trustee, shall serve until the later to occur of:
 - a. That date which is four (4) years following the recording of this Trust; or
 - b. The sale and conveyance of all the Lots in the Subdivision to bona fide third parties.

Following such event, or in the event the Trustee or Successor Trustee of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust is no longer willing or able to serve, then there shall be a total of nine (9) Trustees. Each Owner (as hereinafter defined in Section 4) shall appoint a Trustee to so serve, in accordance with the provisions of this Trust.

3. Purpose of Trust. The purpose of this Trust is to provide for the perpetual preservation, administration and maintenance for the common enjoyment and benefit of the Owners of the ways and improvements, including Proposed Rockwood Lane (Ext.) as shown on the Plans, the 20' Drainage and Landscape Easement and Rockwood Lane Extension (40' Wide - Private), and all the utilities therein, as shown on the Plans. Utilities (defined as all electrical, cable and other underground utilities within the Subdivision which will serve the lots therein) and Drainage Facilities (defined as those facilities within the Subdivision and designated on the Plans which serve conveyance, including the improvements upon the Lots, and filtration purposes related to storm water run-off, including without limitation, drainage swales, detention basins, and other systems as presented on the Plans) as are or may be conveyed to the Trustees, and of any other property, real or personal, which may hereafter be conveyed to or acquired by the Trustees or otherwise made subject to their administration for the benefit of the Owners (collectively, the "Trust Property"). The purpose of the Trust shall also include (a) the exercise of

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the rights and powers of the Trustees set forth herein with respect to all the land within the Subdivision as described in Exhibit A hereto ("the Property") and the building(s) and other improvements which now exist or may hereinafter be constructed thereon, (b) the administration and enforcement of and to insure compliance with the terms and conditions of the Definitive Subdivision Decision (defined in Article 6.f.i.), the Covenant (defined in6.f.ii) and the Declaration (defined in Article 5.p.) and (c) all other purposes set forth herein.

All of the Owners shall have the right to use the Trust Property subject to:

- a. the restrictions and obligations contained herein;
- b. such reasonable rules and regulations as may be adopted and amended from time to time, by the Trustees. No rule or regulation adopted by the Trustees shall be inconsistent with or modify or alter the rights to the Town of Needham as set forth in this Trust;
- c. the limitation that no changes to a Lot may be made if said change impacts the drainage system as determined by the Town of Needham as set forth in the Declaration and by the consultant retained by the Trust to annually inspect each Lot to insure that no change has occurred which would impact the functionality or design of the Drainage Improvements depicted on the Plans;
- d. the terms and conditions of the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant and the Declaration (all as defined in Article 6.f.); and
- e. the Easement (defined in Article 6.f.iii).
- 4. Beneficiaries. The beneficiaries of this Trust shall be the Owners. The word "Owner" shall mean and refer to the record holder from time to time of the legal title of any lot and the building or other improvements, if any, constructed thereon, which constitutes all or a portion of the Property. The holder of legal title shall include the holder of the equity of redemption in the case of mortgaged land and one having a legal life or other estate in possession and excluding a lessee, tenant, mortgagee and one having a legal estate in remainder or otherwise subsequent to a legal estate in possession and also excluding the Trustees as owners of the Trust Property. Two or more persons or entities holding legal title to the same parcel or parcels shall be treated as a single Lot Owner; exercise of their rights as such owners shall be by their unanimous action and their obligations to pay any assessment shall be joint and several. If the same Lot Owner shall hold record title to more than one lot, such Lot Owner shall be treated as a separate Lot Owner for each lot. Each Owner of a Lot through this Trust, shall perform all maintenance, repairs and reconstruction required for or in Rockwood Lane in compliance with and in conformity with the requirements of the Town of Needham and other requirements imposed by law or governmental authority.

The Lot Owners and the Town of Needham are the beneficiaries of the restrictions imposed by the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant, the Declaration, the Easement and the Trust and as such individually and jointly shall have the right to enforce said restrictions, obligations, and rights by injunction or other appropriate judicial proceeding. Lot Owners and the Town of Needham shall, individually and jointly, have the right to enforce the provisions of this Trust by injunction or other proceeding. The Trustees shall cooperate with

representatives of the Town of Needham in enforcing the provisions hereof against any Owner or Owners violating this Agreement. Further, in the event the Trustees fail to own or maintain the Trust Property in reasonable order and condition, the Needham Planning Board may serve written notice of such failure upon the Trustees or Lot Owners and shall include a demand for correction within thirty (30) days of the notice and shall state the date, time and place of a hearing thereof which shall be held within thirty (30) days of the notice. Provided further, however, that in the event that corrective actions require construction activities by the Trust, the thirty (30) day time period shall be extended for such time period as is reasonable due to weather conditions, but in no event shall the period exceed the greater of sixty (60) days of receipt of notice as aforesaid, or the June 1 next following the date of receipt of said notice. All costs incurred by the Town, including attorney's fees, shall be assessed against the Owners (to the extent of their respective shares) and shall become a lien on the lots (and the improvements thereon) which may be collected and enforced in the manner fixed by law, including recordation of the notice of the lien in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds.

Notwithstanding anything in this Trust to the contrary, each Owner shall have the right to maintain, repair, reconstruct or replace any pipe, conduit or line providing any utility service to said Owner's Lot, including, but not limited, to access to Rockwood Lane and to excavation within said Rockwood Lane, if necessary, to conduct said maintenance, repair or replacement. Said Owner shall be responsible for restoring all disturbed areas to the condition that existed prior to such access and insuring that there is no impact to the drainage system, including the cultec systems, undergrounding piping, swales, grading, roof drains and any and all pies and structures (the "Drainage System"). In any event, the Town of Needham shall have the authority. with respect to any Emergency as relates to the maintenance of the Drainage System, to enter and make necessary repairs in order to abate said Emergency. Emergency shall be defined as the creation of a condition that results or could result in flooding of adjacent properties, the overloading of the municipal drainage system or the creation of a condition that is injurious to the public health or safety. All costs incurred by the Town of Needham in the event of such emergency shall be paid by the Trustees within thirty (30) days of written notice to the Trustees by the Town of Needham, and if not paid by the Trustees within said thirty days, then such costs shall be assessed against all the Lot Owners and shall become a lien on all the Lots in the Subdivision which may be collected and enforced in the manner fixed by law for the collection of taxes. Costs shall include the costs of materials and the salary costs of all employees involved with the emergency actions. Notice of lien shall be recorded in the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds.

5. <u>Powers and Duties of Trustees.</u> For the purpose of carrying out the terms of this Trust, the Trustees shall have the powers and duties necessary for the administration of the Trust Property including, without limitation, the following powers which may be exercised by them without any action or consent of the Owners and which shall continue after the termination of the Trust for the purpose of disposing of the Trust Property and until final disposition thereof:

a. the maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the private way known as Rockwood Lane Extension, as shown on the Plans, and to provide adequate services to each Lot, whether the services are located within the private way known as Rockwood Lane, or in the areas shown partially on private ways and partially on individual lots within areas designated on said Plan as "20' Drainage and Landscape Easement", all in accordance with the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant, the Declaration and the Easement.

The Trust shall also have no responsibility for sewerage and other utilities and related equipment located on individual lots (other than those facilities and utilities which are located within the "Proposed 20' Drainage and Landscape Easement", for which the Trust shall have the right and easement to enter such areas to carry out its responsibilities), which shall be the sole responsibility of the Owner of the lot where such facilities and equipment are located

The Trust shall also be responsible for maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the 20' Drainage and Landscape Easement as shown on the Plans, including all actions in kind or nature necessary or appropriate in order to maintain said easements in a good, safe and passable condition, including snowplowing and without limitation in conformance with the provisions of Paragraphs 4 and 5 of the Definitive Subdivision Decision. It is specifically understood and agreed that the Owners of the lots comprising subdivision property, acting through the Trust:

- (i) shall be responsible for all of the obligations contained in said Paragraphs 4 and 5 of the Definitive Subdivision Decision to insure a continuous uninterrupted access from Rockwood Lane for emergency access purposes, and
- (ii) shall be responsible for the construction, maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the sewer, drainage system and grading of the site, all as shown on the Plans, including the annual inspections as set forth in Exhibits C and D.
- b. to acquire by purchase, hire or otherwise, property which is convenient to the performance of their functions as Trustees;

c. to adopt reasonable rules and regulations governing the use and enjoyment by the Owners of the Trust Property provided such rules and regulations are consistent with the terms and conditions of the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant, the Declaration and the Easement. Initial rules and regulations, if any, are attached hereto as Exhibit B and the Trustees shall have the power, right and authority to enforce such rules and regulations, but no obligation to any Owner to do so;

- d. to convey permanent easements and lesser interests in, upon and over any ways for the installation, maintenance, repair and replacement of utilities and other services and rights incidental thereto for the benefit of one or more Owners; or to convey a fee or lesser interest in any ways, utilities, or to convey
- e. to convey permanent easements and lesser interests in, upon and over any ways for the installation, maintenance, repair and replacement of utilities and other services and rights incidental thereto for the benefit of one or more Owners; or to convey a fee or lesser interest in any ways, utilities, or drainage system owned by the Trustees from time to time, for the benefit of one or more Owners.
- f. to convey to the Town of Needham or other public body the fee or any lesser interest in any way and utilities therein or in all or any portions of the drainage system serving the Property;
- g. to make such contracts as the Trustees deem convenient to the performance of their duties;
- h. to borrow money and to pledge or encumber the Trust Property to secure repayment of such borrowings;
- i. to open bank accounts in the name of the Trust or the Trustees with power in any one of the Trustees to draw on such amounts;
- j. to procure insurance against damage to the Trust Property or against any liability of the Trustees or the Owners from any actions occurring on or about or on account of the Trust Property, or workers' compensation insurance or any insurance of any type, nature or description which the Trustees may deem appropriate with respect to the Trust or the Trust Property;
- k. to pay, resist, compromise or submit to arbitration any claim or matter in dispute with respect to the Trust or any Trust property;
- 1. to determine and collect common and special charges from the Owners as provided in this Declaration of Trust and to undertake all expenses and pay all costs on account of such common and special charges;

- m. to maintain, repair and replace any or all of the Trust Property, including but not limited to Rockwood Lane itself;
- n. to exercise any other powers which may be necessary or desirable for carrying out the terms of this Trust or which the Trustees may have under any present or future statute or rule of law, and to execute and deliver all appropriate instruments in connection therewith;
- o. to undertake such maintenance and other obligations and to hire such consultants/engineers and or contractors to perform such inspections or make repairs as required by the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant, the Declaration and the Easement and such other applicable permits and approvals issued for the Trust Property pursuant to G.L. c. 40A and c. 41;
- p. to retain such counsel or accountants as the Trustees shall deem advisable and to pay the costs thereof as a common charge from funds of the Trust;
- q. to take such steps as are necessary to enforce the Declaration of Restrictions of even date and recorded herewith (the "Declaration");
- r. to maintain the landscape vegetation on each of the lots, as more fully described on Exhibit C Landscape Operations and Maintenance Plan November 2014 attached hereto;
- s. to inspect the roadway, utilities and drainage system as depicted on the Plans, as described on Exhibits D Roadway Maintenance & Improvement Plan and E Rockwood Lane Subdivision Construction Period Pollution Prevention Plan and Erosion Control Operation and Maintenance Plan February 2015attached hereto, and to enter any lot and make repairs necessary to restore the functioning of the Drainage System as designed and shown on the Plans to insure compliance with the Definitive Subdivision and the Covenant.
- 6. Common and Special Charges. The Trustees shall from time to time and at least annually, prepare a budget for the Trust to determine the amount of the common charges payable by the Owners to meet the common expenses of the Trust. Trustees shall have the power to raise such amounts of money to meet any needs of the Trust by assessing on each occasion upon all of the land (which term shall include land and improvements) of each Owner such Owner's proportionate share of the total Common Expenses to be raised. The date of each such assessment shall be the date it is voted by the Trustees. Such share shall be determined by dividing the total amount to be raised by the total number of Owners. The Trustees' determination regarding the amount of the assessment shall be conclusive. Common expenses may include, without limitation, the following:

all costs relating to the maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the private a. way known as Rockwood Lane as shown on the Plan and designated thereon and all services, the installation of which is required in connection with the Definitive Subdivision Decision and the Covenant, or which may be installed at any time, including, without limitation, maintenance, repair and reconstruction of roadways, water, sewer and drainage facilities and other utilities and related equipment, curbs, monuments, sidewalks, landscaping and street signs, as and whenever necessary, and including all actions of any kind or nature necessary or appropriate in order to maintain Rockwood Lane in a good, safe and passable condition, including snow plowing, and in conformance with the provisions of Paragraphs 4 and 5 of the Definitive Subdivision Decision, and to provide adequate services to each Lot, all in accordance with the Definitive Subdivision Decision, the Covenant, the Declaration and this Trust. The total Common Expenses shall include a reasonable allowance established by the Trustees for contingencies and reserves.

The Trust shall also have no responsibility for sewerage and other utilities and related equipment located on individual lots, which shall be the sole responsibility of the Owner of the lot where such facilities and equipment are located (other than those drainage related facilities located within the 20' Drainage and Landscape Easement shown on the Plans for which the Trustees shall be responsible). The responsibility of maintenance and supply of electricity for street lighting as described in Paragraph 17 Definitive Subdivision Decision, Rockwood Lane, shall be the responsibility of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust as set forth in Section I of the Declaration. The Trustees shall have the specific authority to assess special charges necessary to fulfill their responsibilities as set forth in this Agreement;

- b. all insurance premiums for the master policy for the Trust Property, fidelity bonds for the Trustee and agents and employees, any insurance purchased to protect the Trustees and such other insurance as the Trustees may deem necessary and appropriate;
- c. all expenses relating to the financing, operation, improvement, maintenance and replacement of any Trust Property;
- d. all costs of attorneys, accountants and other usual, customary or necessary professional advisors to the Trustees:
- e. the amount that the Trustees shall deem necessary and appropriate for the working capital of the Trust, for an operating reserve for expenses, a reserve fund for the replacements, and any charges for deficits from previous operating years; and
- f. all expenses relating to the Trustees' enforcement and administration of the

following;

- i. Definitive Subdivision Decision, Rockwood Lane, dated February 24, 2015, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith ("Definitive Subdivision Decision" Exhibit E attached hereto);
- ii. Subdivision Covenant Under the Provisions of General Laws, Chapter 4, Section 81-U dated May 27, 2015, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith ("Covenant");
- iii. Grant of Access Easement Agreement, dated _______, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith (the "Easement"); and
- iv. The Declaration of Restrictions, dated May 27, 2015, and recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds herewith (the "Declaration").

In addition, the Trustees shall have the power to assess individual Owners for Special Charges in connection with repairs, improvements or replacements, caused or necessitated solely by the actions or omissions of such Owner or for the costs incurred by the Trust to restore the Drainage System due to actions of a Lot Owner.

The Trustees shall upon reasonable request render certificates suitable for recording indicating that no payments are due to the Trust with respect to any common or special charges, which certificates shall be conclusive as to the facts stated therein.

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, the sole cost and responsibility for maintenance, repair, improvement, operation and replacement of street lights and associated equipment in the Subdivision shall be with the Owner from whose property power or electricity is supplied.

The Trust shall maintain a minimum balance in the Capital Reserve Account of \$10,000.00.

- 7. Payment of Common and Special Charges. All Owners shall pay the common charges assessed by the Trustees in twelve (12) installments on the first day of each month and every month, or at such other time or times as the Trustees may reasonably determine. Special Charges shall be paid within thirty (30) days after notice from the Trustees, or as the Trustees in their sole discretion may otherwise require.
- 8. <u>Lien for Common Charges.</u> Each assessment (Common or Special) so made upon an Owner shall constitute and remain a charge and lien upon such Owner's land and every portion thereof from the date of the assessment until paid in full, and shall also constitute a personal debt of the Owner who is the Owner of such land on the date of assessment by the Trustees. All such costs, charges, liens or personal debt may be enforced or collected by the Trustees, by any available process, without limitation, collection proceedings in a Court and foreclosure of the

charges or lien against the land under processes comparable to the processes provided in G. L. c. 254, to the extent allowed by law, for expenses incurred by the Trustees enforcing or collecting any assessment, including reasonable attorney's fees, shall be paid by the Owner responsible for the assessment and shall constitute a lien or charge on said land and a personal debt of said Owner.

Notwithstanding the above provisions, such charge and lien shall be junior to each bona-fide mortgage to an institutional mortgage lender outstanding upon such land on the date of the assessment, whether the mortgage be given before or after this Trust takes effect and its provisions become restrictions and servitudes upon such land, but foreclosure of the mortgage shall not impair the power of the Trustees thereafter to make further assessments upon such nor otherwise impair such restrictions and servitudes thereon. If any assessment is not paid when due, such assessment shall bear interest at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per year from the due date. The Trustees may, in addition to the other rights herein reserved, accelerate the payment of the reasonable estimate of common charges for the twelve month period following any default and such sum shall serve as security for the payment of future common and special charge obligations.

- 9. <u>Liability of Trustee</u>. All persons extending credit to or contracting with or having any claim against the Trustees hereunder shall look only to the Trust Property for any such contract of claim, so that neither the Trustees nor the Owners shall be personally liable therefor. No Trustee hereunder shall be liable to this Trust or to the Owners for the default of any other Trustee or for leaving property in the hands of another Trustee, or for any error in judgment of law on his or her own part, but shall be liable only for his or her own willful default. Any Trustee hereunder shall be reimbursed in full for any loss or expense incurred or suffered by him or her, or his or her estate, as a result of acting as Trustee hereunder, excluding only such loss or expense resulting from his own willful default.
- 10. Reliance by Third Parties. No person dealing with any Trustee shall be bound to inquire concerning the validity of any act purporting to be done by him or her or be bound to see to the application of any money paid or property transferred to him or her upon his or her order. Any Trustee may at any time or times by written power of attorney delegate all or any of his or her powers and authorities, except the power to make assessments as provided in Paragraph 6 above, whether discretionary or otherwise, to any other Trustee in each case for a period of not more than six (6) months at a time, but any such delegation may be renewed by successive powers of attorney and may be revoked.
- 11. <u>Financial Records</u>. The Trustees shall at all times keep proper records and accounts of the affairs of the Trust which shall be open to inspection by any Owner at all reasonable times. At least once a year the Trustees shall render a written report and financial statement to the Owners. The approval by a majority of the Owners of any report or financial statement by the Trustees shall be, as to all matters and transactions stated in said report or statement or shown thereby, a complete discharge of the Trustees and is final and binding upon all Owners. If requested by the Town in writing, a copy of the financial statement shall be provided to the Town.

- 12. <u>Trustees in Number and Terms.</u> After the Initial Trustee, there shall always be nine (9) Trustees. Trustee(s) shall only be Lot Owners or their designee. Except for the Initial Trustee, Trustees shall serve for the entire period of their Lot Ownership. Upon the sale of a Lot, the Owner of the Lot shall become a Trustee and the Lot Owner shall sign and record an Acceptance of Trustee at the Norfolk Registry of Deeds. A Lot Owner's term as Trustee shall automatically expire with the recording of the Lot Owner's Deed conveying the Lot.
- 13. Appointment of Trustee. At each annual meeting of the Owners commencing with the annual meeting to be held after the fourth anniversary of the recording of this Declaration of Trust, or the sale and conveyance of all the Lots to bona-fide third parties as provided in Paragraph 2 above, whichever occurs first, each Owner of Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 shall appoint a Trustee.
- 14. <u>Vacancies and Removals.</u> Any Trustee may at any time resign as Trustee by a written instrument signed by him or her, acknowledged and delivered to the remaining Trustee or Trustees. Upon the death or resignation of any Trustee, a vacancy in the office of Trustee shall be deemed to exist, and a new Trustee shall be elected for the unexpired term by the remaining Trustee or Trustees. Any successor Trustee shall qualify as a Trustee by written acceptance, signed and acknowledged by him. Pending any appointment of a successor Trustee, the remaining Trustee or Trustees shall have and may exercise all powers, authority and discretion conferred by this Trust. Upon election of a successor Trustee, the Trust Property shall vest in successor Trustee and the continuing Trustees, as applicable, without further action. Upon the sale of a Lot, the new Owner shall become the successor Trustee.
- 15. <u>Fidelity Bonds and Surety</u>. The Trustees may obtain fidelity bonds in an amount which they deem reasonably sufficient to cover Trustees and employees of the Trust handling responsibility for the funds. The cost of any such bond shall be a Common Charge as provided in Paragraph 6 above.
- Owners Annual and Special Meetings. Any action or consent by the Owners shall be 16. taken or given at the annual meeting or at any special meeting of the Owners. The annual meeting of the Owners shall be held on the first Wednesday in October of each and every year (or if that be a legal holiday on the next succeeding full business day) at the hour and place to be fixed by the Trustees. If no annual meeting has been held on the date fixed above, a special meeting in lieu thereof may be held. Special meetings of Owners may be called by the Trustees on their own motion and, after the annual meeting following the third anniversary after recording the Declaration of Trust or the sale of all the Lots to bona-fide third parties, as provided in Paragraph 2 above, whichever occurs later, shall be called by the Trustees upon written application to the Trustees of at least 50% of the Owners. A written notice of the place, date and hour of all meetings of the Owners shall be given by the Trustees at least seven (7) days before the meeting to each Owner. Notice need not be given to an Owner if a written waiver of notice, executed before or after the meeting by such owner or this attorney thereunto authorized, is filed with the records of the meeting. Notwithstanding the above, no annual meeting of the Owners shall be held so long as the Initial Trustee remains in office, except with the assent of said Initial Trustee.

- 17. **Quorum.** A majority of the Owners shall constitute a quorum, but if a quorum is not present, a lesser number may adjourn the meeting from time to time and the meeting may be held as adjourned without further notice.
- 18. <u>Voting.</u> Each Owner shall be entitled to one vote for each lot within the Property owned. Such vote may be cast in person or by proxy. Any instrument, executed not more than six (6) months before the meeting, purporting to grant authority to another to cast such vote, duly executed by Owner and acknowledged before a notary public, shall be deemed a proxy. A proxy shall be revocable at any time by written notice to the Trustees. When a quorum is present, any matter before the meeting shall be decided by the unanimous vote of the Owners, if two, and otherwise by a majority vote, except where a larger vote is required by this Trust. Provided further, however, that so long as the Initial Trustee continues to serve, no Owner shall have any voting authority.
- 19. <u>Termination or Amendment by Consent.</u> This Trust may be terminated or amended at any time by an instrument in writing signed by all the Trustees and assented to by the unanimous action of the Owners. Provided further, however, that so long as the Initial Trustee continues to serve, this Trust may be terminated or amended at any time by an instrument in writing signed by the Initial Trustee. No assent to such action from Owners shall be required. No amendment or termination that would change, alter or in any way affect the Trustees' obligation to maintain Rockwood Lane, the Drainage System(s) or Landscape Element, or the Town's right to obtain and enforce liens on the Lots as more fully described herein and as set forth in the Definitive Subdivision Decision or the Covenant shall be effective unless and until the Planning Board of the Town of Needham agrees to such change or termination in writing.
- 20. <u>Disposition of Trust Property.</u> Upon termination of the Trust, the Trust Property shall be conveyed as directed by unanimity of the Owners either (i) to a Trust for the benefit of the Owners for the same or similar purposes as the trust herein created, or (ii) to the Owners as tenants in common, subject to all matters of record which henceforth shall be enforceable by and against the Owners, joint and severally.
- 21. <u>Notices.</u> All notices to the Owners shall be in writing and shall be sent to the Owners or to such one of them as they may designate in writing from time to time, at the last address of such Owner as it appears in the records of the Trust. Changes in the Owners or their addresses shall be noted in the records of the Trust only upon written notice filed with the Trustees. Notice shall be deemed given as of the date of mailing.
- 22. <u>Termination by Law.</u> The Trust shall continue in perpetuity or for the longest period permitted by law and in any event 100 years or unless sooner terminated as herein provided.
- 23. <u>Incumbency of Trustees.</u> A certificate signed by three (3) Trustees and acknowledged before a Notary Public shall be conclusive evidence in favor of any person, firm, corporation, trust or association acting in good faith in reliance thereon as to the truth of any

matter or facts stated therein relating to:

- a. the death, resignation, removal or appointment of a Trustee or to the delegation by a Trustee to another Trustee of his or her powers, authorities and discretions;
- b. compliance by the Trustees and Owners with any requirement of this Trust
- c. the terms of this instrument and any amendment or termination of this Trust;
- d. the fact of the validity of any action taken by the Trustees or Owners and to authority of the Trustees or Owners to take such action; the number of Owners acting in favor of any matters; or
- e. any other matter pertaining to the Trustees, Owners or the Trust Property.

Provided further, however, that so long as Steven Venincasa continues to act as Trustee, the signature of the one Initial Trustee on a certificate and acknowledged before a Notary Public shall be deemed to satisfy the provisions of this Paragraph and all other provisions requiring or authorizing Trustee action.

When recorded with the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds, such certificate shall be conclusive evidence to all persons regardless of whether they have notice thereof or act reliance thereon. The Trust shall provide in writing to the Town of Needham the name of a contact person for all inquiries relating to the Trust or any matter relating to the Property.

- 24. <u>Recording.</u> The termination and all amendments of this Trust and resignations and appointments of Trustees shall be filed with said Registry of Deeds, and any person shall be entitled to rely on the records of said Registry with respect to the termination of the Trust, any amendment thereto and the identity of the Trustees, the identity of the Owners and to any other matter pertaining to the Trust, the Trustees, or the Owners of the Trust Property.
- 25. <u>Disputes.</u> Any Owner aggrieved by any failure or refusal to act by a quorum of the Trustees or by a deadlock among the Trustees, may, within thirty (30) days of such failure, refusal to act, or deadlock, appoint an arbitrator who shall be a member of the American Arbitration Association with not less than seven (7) years experience as an arbitrator. Within ten (10) days after written notice of such appointment, the Trustees shall appoint another such arbitrator, and the two so chosen shall within ten (10) days thereafter choose a third such arbitrator. A majority of such arbitrators shall be entitled to decide any such matter, and their decision shall be rendered within thirty (30) days of the appointment of the third arbitrator. Such decision, subject to Chapter 251 of the General Laws of Massachusetts, as from time to time amended, shall be final and conclusive on all persons. The cost of such arbitration shall be a common charge as provided in Paragraph 6 above. In the event that any party elects to be represented by counsel, all counsel fees shall be the sole responsibility of the party retaining such counsel. This Arbitration provision shall not

apply to the rights of the Town of Needham set forth herein.

26. Construction and Interpretation. In the construction hereof, whether or not so expressed, words used in the singular or in the plural, respectively, include both the plural and singular; words denoting males include females, and words denoting persons include individuals, firms, associations, companies (joint, stock or otherwise), trusts and corporations, unless a contrary intention is to be inferred from or required by the subject matter or context. The captions of Articles and Sections are inserted only for the convenience of reference and are not to be taken to be any part hereof or to control or affect the meaning, construction, interpretation, or effect hereof.

All of the trusts, powers and provisions herein contained shall take effect and be construed according to the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

- 27. Waiver. No restriction, condition, obligation or provision contained in this Declaration of Trust, Definitive Subdivision Decision or the Covenant, shall be deemed to have been abrogated or waived by reason of any failure to enforce the same, irrespective of the number of violations or breaches thereof which occur.
- 28. In case any of the provisions of this Declaration of Trust or of any Rules and Regulations adopted by the Trustees shall be in conflict with any of the provisions of the documents set forth in Paragraphs 5 and 6 above, or the provisions of any statute, then the provisions of said documents or statute; as the case may be, shall control.

Roadway Maintenance & Improvement Plan

The Road Maintenance & Improvement Plan is comprised of two separate plans: the Road Maintenance Plan and the Road Improvement Plan. Each plan has a separate purpose and different components, but collectively, both plans will represent a single management plan that will ensure that Rockwood Lane Extension is properly maintained.

The Road Maintenance & Improvement Plan involves:

1. Annual Inspection of Rockwood Lane Extension and the improvements associated therewith as shown on a plan entitled "Proposed Rockwood Lane (Ext.)" on a plan entitled "Rockwood Lane Subdivision" dated May 6, 2014, last revised September 26, 2014, prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., (the Rockwood Lane Improvements") by a ______ ("Consultant").

The Consultant will submit a copy of his/her Inspection report to the Rockwood Estate Homeowners Trust and the Town Engineer of the Town of Needham. The inspection report shall include a description of the condition of the Rockwood Lane Improvements and recommendations for repairs for bringing any substandard improvement to an acceptable level in the future.

As with any asset, preventive maintenance is the single most important factor in controlling costs and preserving an asset. Preventive maintenance will ensure that the asset (road) will provide acceptable performance throughout its prescribed lifecycle.

Annual Maintenance shall include:

Patching - pot hole/road surface repair

Drainage -catch basin repair

Vegetation management – grass, weeds, tree trimming and mowing (Regular mowing of shoulder and grass strip areas.)

Crack sealing – seal cracks to prevent moisture integration, if necessary

Regular plowing and de-icing, as necessary, to maintain suitable public safety (sanding, salting, etc.). Snow will not be plowed into pile such that it would interfere with stormwater management/drainage management.

Long term Maintenance may include

Application of chip seal

Overlay

Reconstruction

Maintenance operations are designed to maximize the prescribed lifecycle of a road during its serviceable life (minimum 20 years). However, under certain circumstances, the road base may deteriorate and a 20-year design life may be impossible to achieve with only a surface treatment. With proper maintenance the 20 year life would be extended.

ROCKWOOD LANE SUBDIVISION CONSTRUCTION PERIOD POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN AND EROSION CONTROL OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE PLAN FEBRUARY 2015

During The Construction Period the General Contractor shall be responsible for the following:

1. Erosion Control

Erosion control barriers will be placed at the limit of work as indicated on the project plans. Additional erosion control barriers will be placed as determined by the site inspector and in any sensitive areas as work progresses.

A stockpile of additional erosion control barriers shall be kept on site at all times.

Inspection and maintenance shall be the responsibility of the <u>General Contractor (Site Operator)</u>, and will be carried out in accordance with site preparation and erosion and sediment control specifications, the plans and the approved SWPPP.

Erosion controls shall be monitored at a minimum of once a week, immediately after each rainfall, and at least daily during prolonged periods of rainfall periods to determine their effectiveness. Any repairs necessary shall be made immediately. Close attention shall be paid to the repair of damaged barriers undercutting beneath the barriers and flow around the ends of barriers shall be prevented. The deposits shall be removed when the level of deposition reaches 6 inches or one half of the height of the barrier, whichever happens first.

All damage caused by soil erosion or construction equipment shall be repaired at or before the end of each working day.

All catch basins shall be inspected after every rain storm and repairs made as necessary. Sediment shall be removed from the sump after the sediment has reached a maximum of one half the depth of the sump. The sediment shall be removed from the site and properly disposed of. All drainage structures/sumps shall be cleaned completely at the end of construction.

2. Site Access

Site access, for construction equipment will be from Rockwood Lane. Mud removal from truck tires shall be provided for all trucks leaving the site and street sweeping shall be provided as determined by the inspector. Dust control shall be provided to ensure dust from trucks and work areas on the site are minimized to the satisfaction of the town's site inspector.

3. Construction Staging

All construction materials, supplies, trailers and offices, portable toilets, and equipment shall be stored within the limits of the staging area. Temporary trailers and offices may also be located

within the staging area. All temporary stockpiles will be surrounded with haybales / straw wattles and silt fencing as required.

4. Site Grading and Slope Stabilization

The site activities may only commence when the site is stable from erosion and all required control measures are in place and functional.

All surfaces and slopes shall be checked after each major storm event (2 inches or greater in a 24 hour period) to see that vegetation is in good condition. Any rills or damage from erosion shall be repaired immediately to avoid further damage. If seeps develop on the slopes, the area will be evaluated to determine if the seep will cause an unstable condition and shall be stabilized immediately if necessary. Problems found during the inspections by the General Contractor shall be repaired promptly. Jurisdictional areas requiring re-vegetation shall be replanted immediately or stabilized in a manner acceptable to the Planning Board. Slopes and other exposed surfaces receiving vegetation will be maintained as necessary to support healthy vegetation. If stabilization is required during the non-growing season, hay mulch, or a commercially manufactured blanket must be employed to prevent erosion.

Pollution Prevention Measures

- 1. Before, during, and after construction, functional erosion and sedimentation controls shall be implemented to prevent the silting of the wetland areas down-gradient of the site. Wattles, crushed stone, temporary stabilization and other controls shall be properly maintained and are not to be removed until the site is permanently stabilized. Other controls shall be added as warranted during construction. Sufficient extra materials (e.g. wattles and other control materials) shall be stored on site for emergencies.
- 2. A SWPPP shall be submitted for review and approved by the Planning Board prior to the start of work.
- 3. Any stockpiling of loose materials shall be properly stabilized to prevent erosion and siltation. Preventative controls such as hay bales, straw wattles, temporary seeding/mulching and jute covering shall be implemented to prevent such an occurrence.
- 4. There shall be no flooding, ponding, or flood related damage caused by the project or surface run-off emanating from the project on lands of an abutter, nearby or down-gradient of the site.
- 5. There shall be no contaminant migration caused by the project to nearby and down-gradient properties, nearby aquifers, and nearby resource areas.
- 6. The Site Operator shall make sufficient provisions to control any unexpected drainage and erosion conditions that may arise during construction that may create damage on abutting properties. Said control measures are to be implemented at once.
- 7. During construction erosion, and sedimentation controls shall be in place before the natural ground cover is disturbed. Said controls shall be in place prior to other construction work and

shall be monitored and approved by the Site Operator. They shall be properly maintained and are not to be removed until the site is stabilized.

- 8. The Site Operator shall designate a person or persons to inspect and supervise the erosion controls for the project. The town's inspector shall be notified as to the means to contact said individual or individuals on a 24-hour basis on all working and non-working days of the project. Said means of contact shall include at least 2 separate telephone number of said designated person or persons.
- 9. There shall be periodic inspection of wattles, and other erosion controls, by the Operator's Designee to assure continued effectiveness.
- 10. The Site Operator shall make adequate provisions for controlling erosion and sediment from activities that might yield water at high volumes with high suspended solid contents, such as dewatering excavations
- 11. Street sweeping shall be used to keep public ways free and clear of sediment and dirt from the site activities.
- 12. The site operator's designated person shall complete the attached form entitled, "Inspection Report Form for Stormwater System" during their weekly (minimum) inspection. The reports shall be maintained on site and copies available for the town's inspector upon request.

Other Control Measures

Waste Materials. All trash and construction debris from the site will be hauled to an approved landfill or recycling facility. No construction waste material will be buried on the site. All personnel will receive instructions regarding the correct procedure for waste disposal. Notices describing these practices will be posted in the construction office. The site superintendent will be responsible for seeing that these procedures are followed. Employee waste and other loose materials will be collected so as to prevent the release of floatables during rainfall events.

<u>Hazardous Waste</u>. No Hazardous materials are expected to be encountered. The mandated State and Local permits for removal of such materials, if located, will be implemented when such materials are encountered.

<u>Erosion Controls</u>. Sediment deposits that are removed or left in place after the barriers have been dismantled shall be graded manually to conform to the existing topography and vegetated using seeding or other long term cover as approved in the Landscape Plan. Bare ground that cannot be permanently stabilized within 30 days shall be stabilized by temporary measures.

After Construction and release of the Lots by the Planning Board the Neighborhood Association shall be responsible for the following:

General Land Grading and Slopes Stabilization within the Drainage Easement and the street R.O.W

All surfaces and slopes shall be checked bi-annually to see that vegetation is in good condition. Any rills or damage from erosion shall be repaired immediately to avoid further damage. If seeps develop on the slopes, the area will be evaluated to determine if the seep will cause an unstable condition and shall be stabilized immediately if necessary. Problems found during the inspections by the Association shall be repaired promptly. Areas requiring re-vegetation shall be replanted immediately. Slopes and other exposed surfaces receiving vegetation will be maintained as necessary to support healthy vegetation.

Areas of steep slopes (2.5:1 or greater) shall be stabilized using jute mesh or a similar approved erosion blanket.

Street Sweeping

Street areas will be swept with a wet brush street sweeper on a semi-annual basis, with at least two sweepings per year. One sweep shall be done at the end of the winter season (prior to the heavy rains), and the other sweep at the end of autumn (prior to snowfall).

Stormwater Management System

The catch basins shall be inspected annually, and cleaned out when sumps are approximately half full. The use of "clam shells" for sediment removal shall not be allowed; a vacuum truck shall be the approved method of cleaning. Integrity and functionality of oil hoods shall also be checked at the time of the inspection.

The infiltration systems will be inspected at least once each year by removing the manhole/access port covers and determining the thickness of sediment that has accumulated. If sediment is more than six inches deep, it must be suspended via flushing with clean water and removed using a vactor truck.

Water Quality Unit shall be as follows per manufacturer's recommendations:

- Units should be inspected post-construction, prior to being put into service.
- Inspect every six months for the first year of operation to determine the oil and sediment accumulation rate. In subsequent years, inspections can be based on first-year observations but no less than once every two years.
- Cleaning is required once the sediment depth reaches 15% of storage capacity (generally taking one year or longer).
- Inspect the unit immediately after an oil, fuel, or chemical spill.
- A licensed waste management company will remove captured petroleum waste products from any oil, chemical, or fuel spills and dispose responsibly.

This decision is in response to an application for approval by the Petitioner of a Definitive Subdivision Plan submitted to the Board on May 7, 2014, under Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, Sections 81-K through 81-GG, inclusive.

If approved, the plan would create nine (9) building lots. Presently, one of the parcels is occupied by a single family dwelling and associated accessory structures, driveways and yard area. All of the lots would have access from a new roadway that would be a private way extension of the existing public Rockwood Lane (hereinafter the Private Way).

After causing notice of the time and place of its public hearing and of the subject matter thereof to be published, posted and mailed to the Petitioner, abutters and other parties in interest, as required by law, Martin Jacobs, Chairperson of the Board, called the hearing to order on Tuesday, June 10, 2014 at 8:30 p.m. in the Charles River Room, first floor, Public Services Administration Building, 500 Dedham Avenue, Needham, Massachusetts. The Board by a vote of 4-1 hereby APPROVES the Subdivision, as shown on the Plan, located in Needham, Norfolk County, Massachusetts, to be recorded herewith, for the reasons and subject to the plan modifications, conditions and waivers herein set forth. On the motion to approve the Subdivision Board members Bruce T. Eisenhut, Martin Jacobs, Jeanne S. McKnight, and Elizabeth J. Grimes voted in the affirmative with Board member Sam Bass Warner voting in the negative. - 1. The Board hereby waives compliance with the following requirements of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, having found that such action is in the public interest and is not inconsistent with the intent and purposes of the Subdivision Control Law.
- a) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all streets be laid out to a width of 50 feet and approves instead a 40-foot wide right-of-way, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the

provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board acknowledged that the existing right-of-way width for the public portion of Rockwood Lane is 40 feet and that an extension of the private portion of Rockwood Lane at a 40 foot right-of-way width was appropriate. Additionally, the Board found a right-of-way width of 40 feet to be sufficient to accommodate the 9 lot residential subdivision.

- b) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all streets be paved to a width of 24 feet and approves instead a pavement width of 20 feet, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board acknowledged that the existing pavement width for the public portion of Rockwood Lane is 20 feet and that an extension of the private portion of Rockwood Lane at a pavement width of 20 feet was appropriate. Additionally, the Board found a pavement width of 20 feet to be sufficient to accommodate the 9 lot residential subdivision.
- c) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that the maximum grade of a street not exceed eight percent, and approves instead an eight and one-half percent (8.5%) grade at the locale of the new roadway connection to the existing Rockwood Lane pavement for a distance not to exceed 100 feet, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered the unique topographic features of the land as shown on the Plan.
- d) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.16 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require the construction of a sidewalk in accordance with the "Standard Specifications" of the Town of Needham along both sides of Rockwood Lane and approves instead a walkway on only one side of the street, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered that by means of limiting the amount of impervious surface on the site the objective that the drainage system design would be adequate to serve the needs of the 9 residential lots would be addressed so as to minimize off-site drainage impacts on neighboring properties.
- e) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.5 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all cul-de-sacs have a minimum radius of 60 feet and approves instead a hammerhead, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered the Plan and the specific goal of minimizing tree removal at the rear of Lot 6 and Lot 7 which would otherwise be required if a 60 foot radius diameter circle turnaround was to be required.
- f) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.6.1 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that all streets be constructed in accordance with the standard street cross-section and approves instead the cross-section as shown on the Plan, showing a 20-foot pavement width, a sidewalk along one side of the roadway and a uniform cross slope towards one side of the roadway instead of a crowned cross section. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered all matters described in sections 1.a, 1.b, 1.c, 1.d and 1.e above.

- g) The Board hereby waives the requirements of Section 3.3.6 of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, which would otherwise require that bituminous concrete berms be installed along both sides of the roadway at the edge of pavement in a continuous manner and waives the requirement for the placement of cape cod berm along the west side of the proposed roadway, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision. The above-named waiver is subject to the provisions of paragraphs 3 through 13 of this Decision. In the granting of this waiver, the Board considered the need to allow the drainage on the west side of the roadway to flow unimpeded to the swale located east of the roadway as shown on the Plan.
- 2. Petitioner shall cause the Plan and documents to be revised to show the following additional or revised information which modifications shall be subject to review and approval of the Board prior to endorsement of the Plan:
- a) The Plan shall be revised to show a speed bump at the juncture of the private portion of Rockwood Lane with the public portion of Rockwood Lane and which is located entirely on the private portion. Said speed pump shall be installed if the Petitioner is unable to secure approval for a stop sign at the intersection of Rockwood Lane and Richard Road as further described in paragraph 29 of this Decision. In the event that a speed bump is required, as noted herein, it shall be installed at the time the final coat of pavement is laid on the new roadway.
- b) The "Rockwood Lane Subdivision Construction Period Pollution Prevention Plan and Erosion Control Operation and Maintenance Plan", dated July 2014 and comprising a portion of the "Stormwater Management Hydrology Calculations, Rockwood Lane Subdivision, 36 Rockwood Lane, Needham, MA", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014 (Exhibit 21), shall be revised to incorporate the recommendations of the Town of Needham Engineering Department as detailed in Exhibit 87.
- c) The Plan shall be revised to include a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan and further revised to provide for the timely installation of erosion control measures.
- 3. The waiver of street construction requirements, as fully set forth in paragraphs 1.a, 1.b, 1.c, 1.d, 1.e, 1.f, and 1.g is expressly conditioned upon and subject to the restriction that neither the owner nor any successor owner or owners of Lot 1, Lot 2, Lot 3, Lot 4, Lot 5, Lot 6, Lot 7, Lot 8 or Lot 9 as shown on the Plan (hereinafter referred to individually as a Lot or collectively as the Lots) shall use the Lots for any purpose other than single-family residential use or Lot owner home occupations as allowed under the Zoning By-Law, as shown on the Plan, as approved by the Board and recorded herewith, and there shall be no further division of the Lots as shown thereon without the prior written approval of the Planning Board.
- 4. Each and every owner or owners of any Lot shall be jointly and severally responsible and liable, and shall fulfill all lot owners' obligations under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, for the costs of the maintenance, repair and reconstruction of the Private Way shown on the Plan and designated thereon and all services, (whether the services are located within the Private Way or in areas shown partially on the Private Way and partially on a Lot), the installation of which are required in connection with this approval, or which may be installed at any time, including, without limitation, maintenance, repair and reconstruction of roadways, water, sewer and drainage facilities and other utilities and related equipment, curbs, monuments, sidewalks, landscaping and street signs, as and whenever necessary, and including all actions of any kind or nature necessary or appropriate in order to maintain the Private Way in a good, safe and passable condition, including snow plowing, providing access from each Lot to the public

portion of Rockwood Lane, as shown on the Plan, and providing adequate services to each Lot, all in accordance with these conditions. The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall maintain a dedicated capital reserve account having a minimum balance of \$10,000 to meet the obligations of this section.

- 5. Each and every owner or owners of any Lot shall be jointly and severally responsible and liable, and shall fulfill all Lot owners' obligations under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, for all maintenance, repairs and reconstruction required for or on the Private Way in compliance with and in conformity with requirements of the Town of Needham and other requirements imposed by law or governmental authority. The within requirement shall be included in all deeds of the Lots.
- 6. The Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement and each owner of a Lot shall not use or permit use of the Private Way for any purpose other than ingress and egress from the Lots by the residents of the Lots and their guests and invitees, such use to be limited to pedestrian and private-passenger vehicular traffic, and such other vehicular traffic as is necessary from time to time in cases of emergency, delivery of customary and usual household services and equipment or in connection with the maintenance, repair or reconstruction of the Private Way, the Lot, and any structures thereon and services installed thereon, or hereunder.
- 7. No owner or owners of any Lot shall park or cause to be parked any motor vehicle on the Private Way. A no parking sign shall be posted on the turn-around abutting Lot 6 stating "No Parking Emergency Vehicles Only".
- 8. Neither the Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement shall perform, nor shall they permit changes to be made to any Lot, which would impact the functionality or design of the drainage improvements as shown on the Plan.
- 9. Any and all maintenance, repair or reconstruction work performed on or to the Private Way or in connection with services installed thereon or hereunder by or at the direction of any owner or owners of any Lot or the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement as provided herein shall be carried out so as to ensure that no fill material nor any products or excavation or erosion resulting from or arising in connection with such work shall be discharged into any storm drainage system, and soil and other material or debris shall be removed from the site only if such removal will not impact the functionality or design of the drainage improvements shown on the Plan, and only to the extent necessary in connection with such work.
- 10. No Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement shall at any time request that the Private Way be laid out or accepted as a public way in the Town of Needham unless such owner or owners or Trustees at its or their sole expense, perform and complete such work as is necessary to cause the Private Way to comply with all standards and regulations of the Town of Needham without waiver, and obtain all permits and approvals required by law in connection therewith. If the Private Way is accepted by the Town of Needham as a public way at any time, then the provisions hereof applicable to ownership and maintenance of the Private Way shall thereupon terminate.
- 11. No Lot owner nor the Trustees under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement, shall at any time request or petition that any drainage system, water pipes, sewer pipes or related equipment or any other improvement within the subdivision for which design or improvement requirements have been waived by the Board as provided herein, be accepted or maintained by the Town of Needham.

- 12. The Town of Needham and its designees shall have the right to enter upon the Private Way for all purposes for which public ways are used in the Town of Needham.
- 13. In any sale or transfer by the owner or any successor owner of any of the Lots, the deed or other instrument shall refer to and incorporate conditions 3 through 12 inclusive and condition 15, and any conveyance shall include transfer of a fee interest or the perpetual right and easement to use the Private Way in common with others lawfully entitled thereto for all purposes for which public ways in the Town of Needham may now or hereafter be used consistent with the provisions hereof, and the subsurface areas, equipment and facilities used and maintained in connection with the provision of water, sewer, drainage and other utility services provided to the conveyed premises. Any deed or other instrument purporting to transfer or convey any interest in any Lot or Lots which does not expressly refer to and incorporate these conditions shall nevertheless be deemed to contain the same and in all events shall be subject thereto.
- 14. The Petitioner shall deliver to the Board a Restrictive Covenant incorporating conditions 3 through 12 inclusive and condition 15 of this Decision in a form suitable for recording in the Registry of Deeds that shall run with the land and shall be enforceable by the Town. Such restriction shall be referenced on the Plan and shall be recorded therewith. Said covenant shall be enforceable in perpetuity or for the longest period permitted by law and in any event for 100 years.
- 15. The Petitioner shall grant a 13-foot wide pedestrian access easement to the Town of Needham as a condition of this approval. The pedestrian access easement as shown on the Plan generally runs over the westerly edge of Lot 6. The 13-foot access easement is to be used by members of the public for walking and as access to Town of Needham property to the north of the subdivision. Gatherings, parties, use of alcoholic beverages or drugs are strictly prohibited. The easement shall only be available between the hours of dawn and dusk. No structures are to be placed within the 13-foot easement area nor are any other improvements permitted which would impede or obstruct the passage of pedestrian access. In accordance with the provisions of MGL Chapter 21, Section 17C, the Petitioner, his successors and assigns shall not be liable for personal injuries or property damage sustained by such members of the public, including without limitation a minor, while on said land resulting from the grant of said easement, in the absence of willful, wanton, or reckless conduct by said Petitioner. Such access shall not confer upon any member of the public using said land, including without limitation a minor, the status of an invitee or licensee to whom any duty would be owed by said Petitioner. In addition to the abovenoted 13-foot pedestrian access easement, the Petitioner shall provide a pedestrian access easement across the entirety of the Private Way to be used by members of the public for walking and as pedestrian access to Town of Needham property to the north of the subdivision. Parking of motor vehicles by members of the public shall not be permitted on the Private Way.

It shall not be the responsibility of the Petitioner, and it shall not be a condition precedent to the relief and permissions granted by this Decision, or the construction of the subdivision and sale of Lots, for Petitioner to obtain the acceptance of said easements by the Town of Needham, provided that the Petitioner shall obtain the subordination or partial release of all mortgages or monetary liens encumbering the easement areas and shall deliver same with the easements(s). The Petitioner shall record the noted easements and shall provide an attorney's certification stating that as of the date of the recording of the easement, the Town has a good and clear record and marketable easement.

- 16. In any sale or transfer by the record owner of Lot 6, as shown on the Plan, or any successor record owner of title to Lot 6, as shown on the Plan, the deed or other instrument shall refer to and incorporate by reference condition 15 of this Decision. Any deed or other instrument purporting to transfer or convey any interest in Lot 6 which does not expressly refer to and incorporate condition 15 shall, nevertheless, be deemed to contain the same and all events shall be subject thereto.
- 17. Street lighting shall be provided in the subdivision in accordance with the Plan. The light sources shall be on posts at least 10 feet high and shall be controlled by photovoltaic switches. Post lighting shall be supplied as shown on the Plan. The lighting system shall be maintained and the electricity shall be supplied by the Lot owners, and each Lot owner shall fulfill all Lot owner obligations relating thereto under the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement.
- 18. The Lot owners and the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall maintain the landscape vegetation within the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" and the Private Way in accordance with the Plan entitled, "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Needham, Massachusetts", prepared by Radner Design Associates, Inc., 945 Concord Street, Suite 100, Framingham, MA 01701: Sheet L1, entitled "Landscape Plan," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014, September 26, 2014, October 31, 2014 and December 18, 2014; Sheet L2, entitled "Planting Details," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014; and Sheet L3, entitled "Landscape Details," dated May 6, 2014, revised July 3, 2014, August 22, 2014 and September 26, 2014. There shall be no further changes to the landscape approach as depicted on the above-noted plans, which formed the basis of the findings of fact upon which the drainage system design was derived and approved, except as otherwise provided in paragraph 19.
- 19. There shall be no alteration or change to a Lot so as to effect the drainage system for any Lot, or the drainage systems running across a Lot, as shown on the Plan, as modified by this Decision, without the prior written approval of the Planning Board or Town Engineer as noted below. Any Lot owner who proposes to make a change from the approved Plan shall first file a copy of a plan depicting the proposed changes with the Needham Town Engineer, with a request for a determination as to whether the changes affect the drainage system. If the Town Engineer determines that the changes affect the drainage system, or if the Town Engineer fails to respond to the request for a determination within 45 days, the Lot owner may file the plan with the Planning Board for its review. In such event, the Lot owner shall file with the Planning Board such information as the Planning Board determines necessary for its review. The Planning Board shall hold a public hearing within 60 days of receiving a complete filing. After said public hearing, the Board may, in its sole discretion, find that the proposed changes do not appear to negatively impact down gradient property owners or interfere with the functioning of the drainage system(s) of the Lot or subdivision. In such event the Lot owner, only upon receipt of a written decision from the Planning Board, may implement the changes as shown on the new plan.
- 20. The Town of Needham shall have the authority with respect to any emergency as relates to the maintenance of the drainage system, to enter and make necessary repairs in order to abate said emergency. Emergency shall be defined as the creation of a condition that results or could result in flooding of adjacent properties, the overloading of the municipal drainage system or the creation of a condition that is injurious to the public health or safety. Within thirty days of invoice by the Town all costs incurred by the Town of Needham in the event of such emergency shall be paid by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust, and if not paid within said thirty days, then such costs shall be assessed against all the Lot owners and shall become a lien on all the Lots in the subdivision which may be collected and enforced in the manner fixed by law for

the collection of taxes. All costs shall include, but shall not be limited to, the cost of materials and the salary costs for all employees involved with the emergency actions. Notice of lien shall be recorded in the Norfolk County Registry of Deeds.

- 21. Off-street drainage surety in the amount of \$31,500.00 shall be posted (\$3,500.00 per lot) prior to the release of Lots 1-9 inclusive as shown on the Plan for purposes of building or conveyance. As recommended in the memo of the Board of Health dated May 28, 2014, all lots shall be graded to the limits of construction so as to have no standing water and/or otherwise create a public health nuisance. Grading shall not improperly shed or illegally increase drainage onto adjacent properties. All subsequent developers or builders shall be notified of the off-street drainage bond and the specific off-street drainage requirements. If required by the Board of Health, an as-built certified grading plan(s) of all or any of the lots shall be submitted prior to release of the drainage surety.
- 22. In order to maximize the continued effectiveness of Stormwater Management Best Management Practices for the Rockwood Lane Subdivision, the operations and maintenance requirements as outlined in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87) shall apply to all stormwater facilities within the development. The stormwater facilities are depicted on the Plan and are hereinafter referred to as the "Stormwater Facilities". Operations and maintenance tasks shall be commenced once each respective stormwater facility is fully constructed and is receiving runoff from the new roadway system or house.
- 23. Prior to subdivision bond release, commencement of the operations and maintenance obligations by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust and/or Petitioner shall be on a Lot by Lot basis and shall commence once each individual stormwater facility construction is substantially complete. Each transfer of operational control to the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall be documented by a letter to the Planning Board and Department of Public Works indicating the stormwater facilities which are substantially complete and transferred to the Trust for operation and maintenance. The Petitioner shall be responsible for the completion of construction of any stormwater management facilities in accordance with the approved permits and plans.

After subdivision bond release and after completion of the stormwater facilities on a particular Lot, as evidenced by release of the Planning Board bond for the associated items, the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall be responsible for all operations and maintenance requirements for the stormwater facilities within the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" and within the Private Way along with any future construction or repair of the stormwater facility. Roof runoff infiltration systems and yard run-off systems located outside of the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" shall be the responsibility of the owner of each Lot.

- 24. Operations and Maintenance Tasks shall be completed in accordance with the Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary, prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87).
- 25. Every Lot owner of Lots 1 through 9, as shown on the Plan, shall maintain and keep operational their respective roof runoff system and yard system in accordance with the Plan, as

approved by this Decision, and as further described in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary", prepared by Samiotes Consultants, Inc., 20 A Street, Framingham, MA 01701, dated May 6, 2014, revised July 7, 2014, September 26, 2014, submitted October 31, 2014 (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87). Gutters and downspouts shall be maintained in good working order at all times. Care shall be taken to retain the landscaping as shown on the Plan. Any shrubs that die shall be replaced by the Lot owner. The Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall inspect the roof and yard systems once per calendar year shortly after a small rainstorm event to ensure proper operation and to ensure that the runoff from the entire roof area of the house system is draining into the roof system and where applicable, that runoff from the yard is draining into the yard system. Additionally, the landscaping, as shown on the Plan, shall be inspected to assure compliance with the approved landscape plan. Systems shall be replaced/repaired by individual Lot owners as needed to ensure their continued operation in accordance with the Plan and the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary" (Exhibit 58) as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87).

- 26. Except for the individual house roof and yard systems noted in paragraphs 23 and 25 above, which shall be the responsibility of the owner of the Lot on which said system resides, the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust shall be responsible for all future costs and work associated with the reconstruction or replacement of any of the facilities noted on the Plan or in the "Rockwood Lane Subdivision, Stormwater Management Summary" (Exhibit 58), as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer (Exhibit 87), as being the responsibility of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust to maintain. Such facilities include: (a) All stormwater facilities located within the roadway; and (b) All stormwater facilities located within the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement".
- 27. The following information shall be submitted by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust no later than December 31st of each calendar year to the Town of Needham Department of Public Works, Planning Board and Board of Health to assure compliance with the Operations and Maintenance Plan: (a) An updated list of which types of roof and yard systems each lot within the development has employed for use by future inspectors of said systems; (b) statement, signed by an authorized representative of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust indicating that the requirements of the Operations and Maintenance Plan were performed during the previous calendar year, provided that where requirements were not met, a schedule for their completion shall be provided and a follow-up statement submitted when complete; (c) list of the maintenance activities performed along with the approximate date of the work; (d) list of the inspections performed along with a statement by each inspector summarizing the results of the inspections performed in accordance with the approved Operations and Maintenance Plan; (e) copies of appurtenant documentation supporting the completion of the Operations and Maintenance responsibilities such as copies of contracts and/or receipts with parties engaged to perform maintenance and inspection services; (f) notation regarding whether there has been any change in the name or contact information for the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust. Additionally, relevant information reasonably requested by the Planning Board shall be provided by the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust.
- 28. The Petitioner has submitted a letter (Exhibit 59) which provides a list of actions that will be taken to address the NPDES Stormwater Phase II requirements: Control Measure #1- "Public Education and Outreach" and Control Measure #2, "Public Participation/Involvement". Petitioner shall implement said measures as proposed prior to the release of the subdivision lots.

- 29. The Petitioner shall review placement of a stop sign at the intersection of Rockwood Lane and Richard Road with the Town of Needham Traffic Management Advisory Committee and if approved by said Committee shall coordinate its installation with the Department of Public Works.
- 30. The Planning Board has determined that the project's scale, complexity and potential impacts warrants the use of outside consultants (such as engineers) to ensure compliance with the approved subdivision plan and all other relevant laws and regulations. Such assistance shall include, but shall not be limited to, monitoring or inspecting the project site for compliance with the Board's decisions or regulations and inspecting the project during construction and implementation. Accordingly, following approval of the definitive subdivision plan and before actual construction begins, the Petitioner shall provide a detailed work program and associated work schedule for project construction and implementation to the Director of Public Works. The noted work program and schedule shall provide the basis for determining the initial Project Inspection Fee required hereunder. The Project Inspection Fee as estimated by the Needham Department of Public Works and approved by the Planning Board shall be provided by the Petitioner for deposit in an account established pursuant to G.L. c. 44, s. 53G (53G Account). No work shall commence on the subdivision until the fee has been paid in full. Should the balance in the required 53G account fall below 25% of the initial Project Inspection Fee, as noted above, the Planning Board may require the Petitioner to provide a supplemental Project Inspection Fee to cover the cost of the remaining inspection process.
- 31. The Petitioner shall follow the Construction Minimization and Mitigation measures outlined in the Construction Minimization and Mitigation Measures Plan (Exhibit 86). Mitigation measures shall include, but are not limited to: (1) use of blasting as the preferred form of ledge and rock removal, to reduce or eliminate the need for hoe rams (generally used for ledge and subsurface rock removal during site development), rock drills and pile drivers, as well as rock crushing devices (hereinafter "Impact Devices"); (2) sufficient drill hole density at the blast site to minimize large boulders that would require subsequent hoe ramming to process such boulders into smaller rocks. Boulders resulting from blasting shall not be processed into smaller rocks at the site but shall be removed to an appropriate site outside of Needham for this purpose. Additionally, rock crushing activities shall not be permitted at the site but shall only be conducted at an appropriate location outside of Needham. The Petitioner shall establish a 24-hour construction hotline to investigate and resolve all noise complaints to the satisfaction of the Planning Board. The name of the construction supervisor and contact information shall be mailed to the abutting residents prior to the start of site construction.
- 32. A schedule indicating days and hours of all planned use of Impact Devices, if required, shall be developed and provided to the Building Commissioner, Town Engineer, Board of Health Director and Planning Board at least one week before any such planned activity. A daily log shall be kept for the length of the project recording the days and hours of the use of specific Impact Devices. Non-compliance with the Construction Minimization and Mitigation Measures Plan and the conditions of this Decision may result in the issuance of cease and desist orders by the Building Commissioner, to be enforced by the Police Department as necessary.
- 33. The Petitioner shall follow the Rockwood Lane Subdivision Construction Period Pollution Prevention Plan and Erosion Control Operation and Maintenance Plan, dated July 2014. (Exhibit 68 as revised per the requested modifications of the Town Engineer as detailed in Exhibit 87).
- 34. The Petitioner shall follow the Rockwood Lane Landscape Operations and Maintenance Plan, undated (Exhibit 39) and the 2015 Landscape Maintenance Proposal, prepared by Labadini

Corporation, 355 Boston Post Road West, Marlborough, MA 01752, dated August 19, 2014 (Exhibit 38).

- 35. Following approval of the definitive subdivision plan and before actual construction begins the Petitioner shall meet with the Director of Public Works and his staff. The Petitioner is urged to bring his engineer, roadway contractor and lot developers to this pre-construction meeting. Any problems contemplated in the construction phase, as well as inspection status, contact persons, etc. will be discussed, as well as procedures to be followed. A summary of said meeting, as prepared by the Department of Public Works Director, shall be initialed by himself and the Petitioner and forwarded to the Director of Planning and Community Development.
- 36. A Construction Access Plan shall be submitted for approval by the Needham Police Chief and if so approved shall be submitted to the Needham Building Inspector for approval. Said plan shall show proposed truck delivery routes to and from Route 128 to the subject site and authorized delivery times for enforcement purposes. Not intended for inclusion in the Construction Access Plan are passenger vehicles, pick-up trucks and panel trucks all with a maximum weight of three (3) tons. No construction shall begin until the Construction Access Plan has been approved. All contractors, subcontractors and vendors shall be contractually required to agree to the requirements of the Construction Access Plan to work on this project. The Petitioner shall post signs on-site regarding approved truck delivery routes and authorized delivery times for enforcement purposes. On school days, construction traffic shall be eliminated to the subdivision, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m., and between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. On early release days, construction traffic shall be eliminated to the subdivision, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m., and between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 12:30 p.m.
- 37. The following safeguards shall be implemented during construction:
- a. The hours of construction and construction related activities shall be limited to 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
- b. The Petitioner's contractor shall designate a person who shall be responsible for the construction process. That person shall be identified to the Police Department, the Department of Public Works, the Building Inspector and the abutters and shall be contacted if problems arise during the construction process. The designee shall also be responsible for assuring that truck traffic and the delivery of construction material does not interfere with or endanger traffic flow on Rockwood Lane. The designee shall supply a phone number where the designee can be reached 24 hours per day.
- c. The Petitioner shall take appropriate steps to minimize, to the maximum extent feasible, dust generated by the construction, including, but not limited to, requiring subcontractors to place covers over open trucks transporting construction debris or materials to or from the site and keeping Rockwood Lane clean of dirt and debris and watering appropriate portions of the construction site from time to time as may be necessary.
- d. The Petitioner shall install and maintain a tire tracking pad for trucks leaving the site before they enter onto the public portion of Rockwood Lane.
- 38. All trees having a caliper of 6 inches as measured three feet off the ground bordering "Rockwood Lane" and on the site shall be retained and not disturbed or destroyed during

construction of the subdivision except for those trees which must be removed for the construction of the proposed way, driveways, utilities, and dwellings and uses accessory thereto.

- 39. Prior to site alteration the Petitioner shall mark in the field those trees which the landscape plan indicates will be retained. Such trees identified to be preserved shall be distinguished with appropriate markings, which may include surrounding fences or stakes. Any such trees removed which were identified for retention shall be replaced with trees of similar quality and caliper or as otherwise approved by the Board.
- 40. A Department of Environmental Protection sewer extension and connection permit may be required to service the subdivision and abutting lots. If required, approval of this subdivision is subject to the granting by the Board of Selectmen and the Department of Environmental Protection of a Sewer Extension and Connection Permit.
- 41. Any and all special permits required by the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority shall be obtained at the expense of the Petitioner.
- 42. A special sewer connection permit program fee shall be paid for all lots within the subdivision.
- 43. Grade adjustment rings are not permitted to adjust gate boxes and/or other castings. The Petitioner shall use appropriately sized castings.
- 44. All catch basins shall remain functional at all times. Rims shall be set at binder elevation and shall be adjusted to finish course elevation prior to placement of the top course of pavement.
- 45. If the binder course of pavement is exposed to one winter season, it shall be chipsealed prior to September I of the following winter season. If the roadway work is not completed prior to the third winter season, road reconstruction may be required by the Highway Superintendent.
- 46. During initial construction, no openings to the chipseal shall be made between the months of November 30 and April 1 prior to the placement of the top course of pavement.
- 47. The construction, operation and maintenance of the subdivision shall be conducted in accordance with the EPA's Memorandum of Understanding signed by the Board of Selectmen.
- 48. "As-built" construction plans of the sewer, water and drainage utilities shall be submitted to the Department of Public Works and the Planning Board for review and approval prior to release of the respective performance bond amounts.
- 49. All future sewer tie-ins to properties located outside of this subdivision shall be accomplished in a manner consistent with the "Town of Needham Master Plan of Connection to the MWRA Sewer" dated January 8, 1988, (as revised) and prepared by the Needham Public Works, Sewer Division.
- 50. Prior to the commencement of any street construction within the subdivision, the location of future street lighting, location of fire alarm circuits and outlets, and the location of underground power to serve these shall be shown on an amended version of the definitive utility plan to be filed with the Board and Public Works Department.

- 51. The provisions of M.G.L., Chapter 131, Section 40 and 40A and the Needham Wetlands Protection By-Law shall be satisfied.
- 52. All construction staging and parking shall be on-site. No parking of any vehicles related to the construction shall be permitted on Richard Road, the public portion of Rockwood Lane, or on any other public street.
- 53. All areas where utilities are proposed shall be compacted to the satisfaction of the Public Works Department.
- 54. In the absence of any details or waivers set forth herein, the current Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board shall govern and are hereby made a part of this Decision. All construction details not specifically shown on the approved Plan shall conform to Department of Public Works specifications.
- 55. The developer is directed to submit the Subdivision Inspection Form during all phases of construction as required, in accordance with Appendix E of the Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board.
- 56. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, the Petitioner shall have two years from the date of endorsement of the Plan to complete the installation and construction of Rockwood Lane, and the services provided therein, in accordance with the applicable Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board. Failure to so complete shall automatically rescind approval of the Subdivision Plan unless an extension is otherwise granted by the Planning Board.
- 57. The Petitioner shall enter a written agreement to guarantee completion, once commenced, of the required improvements for all Lots in the Subdivision, as shown on the Plan, with such construction and installation to be additionally secured by one of the methods delineated under the provisions of Section 3.5.1. Such agreement shall be subject to review and approval of the Planning Board prior to endorsement of the Plan.
- 58. The Petitioner has delivered to the Planning Board for its review and approval an easement deed to the Town of Needham granting to the Town the right to pass on foot or by vehicle over the Private Way, and over the "13-foot Wide Access Easement" on Lot 6 and access rights over the "20-foot Drainage and Landscape Easement" on each of the Lots (Exhibit 67), a Declaration of Restrictions (Exhibit 67), and Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust Agreement (Exhibit 88) ("the Documents"). The Petitioner shall finalize the Documents to address the requirements of this Decision and of Town Counsel and shall submit the Documents to the Planning Board for final review and approval of the Board prior to endorsement of the Plan. The Petitioner shall deliver to the Planning Board for its review and approval a duly executed Subdivision Covenant and a duly executed Restrictive Covenant, in a form approved by the Board and incorporating the conditions of this Decision, (the "Covenants"). The Covenants and Documents shall be referenced on the Plan and all documents shall be recorded with the Plan.
- 59. Prior to the release of any lots for building or sale, copies of the recorded instruments described in paragraphs 14, 15, 16, and 58 of this Decision and copies of the recorded plan shall be provided to the Planning Director. Prior to the release of Lot 6 copies of the recorded instruments described in paragraph 15 of this Decision shall be provided to the Planning Director.

60. The Petitioner shall present the Plan to the Board for proper endorsement within ninety (90) days of the date this Decision is executed unless such time period is extended, in writing, by the Board. The Board reserves the right to rescind its approval if said Plan is not presented to the Board for endorsement within the time period herein specified. Further, the Petitioner or his authorized representative shall submit the Plan to the Planning Director fourteen (14) days in advance of its scheduled presentation to the Planning Board to allow adequate time to review the revised Plan for compliance with the conditions of this Decision.

The foregoing have been stated for the purpose of emphasizing their importance and are not intended to be all inclusive or to negate any provision of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Rules and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board.

Under the provisions of the Town of Needham, Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board and Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, Sections 81-K through 81-GG, inclusive, the Board shall have the power to modify or amend the terms and conditions of this approval after due notice on the application of the owner, lessee or mortgagee of the premises or upon its own motion. All the provisions of the Subdivision Control Law applicable to approval shall, where appropriate, is applicable to such modification or amendment. Such power is hereby reserved. Appeals, if any, shall be made pursuant to Section 81-BB of the Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 41, and shall be filed within twenty (20) days after the date of filing this Decision with the Town Clerk.

The provisions of this Approval and Conditions shall be binding upon every owner or owners of each of the lots, as shown on the Plan, and the executors, administrators, heirs, successors and assigns of such owners, and the obligations and restrictions herein set forth shall run with said land in full force and effect for the benefit of and enforceable by the Town of Needham. Reference to this Approval shall be entered upon the Plan and this Approval shall be recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds with the Plan. The Lot Owner agrees to reimburse the Town for its reasonable costs in connection with the enforcement of and/or the correction of violations of the conditions of this permit. Counsel for the Petitioner shall certify to the Town that this approval and all easement and restrictive covenants required hereunder have been recorded and are effective record encumbrances upon the subject property.

- I. The said Developer is the owner of record of the premises shown on said Plan.
- II. This Covenant shall run with the land and shall be binding upon the executors, administrators, heirs, assigns to the respective owners and developers and their successors in title to the Premises, as shown on said Plan.
- III. In addition to the regular requirements relative to the grading and construction of streets and the installation of municipal services, said Rockwood Lane Extension and Lots 1 through 9, inclusive, shall be subject to all of the sixty (60) conditions and any subsequent amendments to the Definitive Subdivision Decision, 36 Rockwood Lane, dated February 24, 2015 (the "Decision"), a copy of which is on file with the Town Clerk's Office, Needham Town Hall and is recorded herewith.

AND WHEREAS, the Developer has agreed to subdivide the land, to construct ways and to install municipal services therein in accordance with the Plan in accordance with all approvals imposed by the Town and has elected to give a Covenant to the said Town to insure the construction of ways and installation of municipal services as shown on said Plan as authorized by Subsection (2) of Section 81-U of General Laws, including all conditions as set forth in:

- (3) Board of Selectmen Sanitary Sewer Conditions

are herewith made a part of this Covenant as set forth in the Planning Board's Definitive Subdivision Decision dated February 24, 2015 (the "Decision"). It is further agreed by the Owner, by signing the within Covenant, that it agrees to such requirements and also waives all rights of appeal. And further the Board of Health drainage surety referred to in the Definitive Subdivision Decision shall be in a form of surety acceptable to the Planning Board and Board of Health. - (A) Except as to those standards that were waived by the Planning Board in the Decision, paragraphs 1 (a) through (g), or as may be further revised through any amendment of that Decision, all streets, including walks, berms, curbing, street name signs, bounds, retaining walls, slopes and fences, and all utilities, including, but not limited to, storm drains, sanitary

sewers, water mains and their appurtenances such as manholes, catch basins, curb inlets, gate valves, hydrants, and headwalls, shall be constructed or installed at the expense of the Developer to the entire limits of the subdivision in strict compliance with the "Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board of the Town of Needham, Massachusetts", as most recently amended, including the "Standard Specifications for Highways" and the "Standard Cross-Section for Street Construction" referred to therein, as most recently revised, which Subdivision Regulations and Procedural Rules and Standard Specifications are specifically incorporated herein by reference, and to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works of the Town of Needham, including all maintenance and repairs necessary to maintain said streets and utilities in a condition satisfactory to the Town until all lots and all sureties, as provided in Section IV herein have been released by the Town upon the completion of all terms and conditions of this Covenant except as otherwise presented in said definitive plan.

- (B) Street construction work shall conform with the details as noted on the approved plans and conditioned in the Decision. Where applicable, excavation and fill to the surface of the sub-grade fifteen (15) inches below the finished surface grade for the roadway and the necessary excavation and fill for sidewalks and berms within the total width of the street; application of ten (10) inch depth of gravel sub-base and a two (2) inch depth of crushed bank gravel base, the surface of which shall be treated with one (1) application of bitumen; application of bituminous concrete pavement Type I-1 to be constructed in two (2) courses top course of 1" bituminous concrete and bottom course of 2" bituminous concrete, application of eight (8) inch depth of gravel sidewalks with bituminous concrete surface applied in two (2) one-inch courses four and one-half (4 1/2) feet wide as indicated in paragraph "A" above and including all driveway entrances; application of six (6) inch depth of loam and seeding for grass plots between the edge of the roadway and the walkway or the sidelines of the street; granite or reinforced concrete curbing to be installed on all curves having a radius of sixty (60) feet or less, except for temporary turnarounds.
- (C) A contractor approved by the Superintendent of the Water Division shall be engaged by the Developer at their expense for the installation of the water mains in accordance with the requirements of and to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of said Water Division.

- (iii) This estimate shall also include the cost of all materials plus a 20% overhead charge on all materials furnished by the Town.

- (F) Granite or concrete bounds, at least four (4) feet long, shall be set at all points in every street or other permanent marks acceptable to and approved by the Town Engineer shall be set within the subdivision. After installation of such bounds, the Developer shall submit to the Engineer a written certification by a registered land surveyor stating that the said bounds are located as shown on the subdivision plans recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds or in the Land Court.
- (G) The Developer hereby grants to the Town of Needham a perpetual right and easement to enter upon the streets for all appropriate purposes for which public ways are used in the Town of Needham, but shall not excavate such Private Way without consent of the Rockwood Estates Homeowners Trust (except in an emergency) (the "Access Easement"). The Developer agrees for itself that as long as it remains the Developer of said premises, it will keep all catch inlets and access thereto clear and free of all debris and/or other materials which might interfere with the proper operation of said drains, and thereafter the owners of said premises will keep catch basin inlets and access thereto clear and free of all debris and/or other materials which might interfere with the proper operation of said drains.
- (H) Permanent street name signs will be furnished and erected at all entrances, the name to be in conformity as to size and quality with signs now generally in use in the Town of Needham.
- (i) Co-incident with the start of any street within a subdivision, temporary street signs shall be installed at all points where permanent signs will be required. These signs may be painted using black block lettering not less than four (4) inches high on a light background.
- (ii) Complete visibility of these signs must be maintained at all times until they are replaced with the permanent signs specified in this Section H.

- (iii) Permanent street signs and the size and other details shall be 'furnished and installed at no expense to the Town as directed by the Town's Director of Public Works.
- (I) Install bounds to define the street line at the direction of the Town Engineer and submit to said Town Engineer a certificate by a Registered Land Surveyor that said bounds have been so installed.
- (J) Prior to the commencement of construction on all major phases of the subdivision including installation of the sewer, water, drains, and street construction, the Developer will notify the Director of Public Works and obtain necessary signatures on the Subdivision Inspection Form.
- V. The construction of all ways and the installation of all municipal services shall be completed in accordance with the applicable Subdivision Rules and Regulations and Procedural Rules of the Planning Board, as well as the requirements contained in Sections III and IV above, (except to the extent that applicable standards were waived by the Planning Board as described in paragraph IV(A) above) within a period of two (2) years from the date of the endorsement by the Board of the Plan. Failure to so complete shall automatically rescind approval of the subdivision plan, unless such approval is further extended by the Planning Board on request of the Developer, its successors and/or assigns.

Registered Marijuana Dispensary Applications

The Board of Selectmen may provide a letter of support or non-opposition with respect to any application seeking to locate a Registered Marijuana Dispensary (RMD) in Needham after a public hearing and consultation with the Town Manager.

Prior to the hearing being scheduled:

- 1. The applicant entity must have filed an Application of Intent with the State Department of Public Health (DPH) and received an invitation to submit a siting profile from DPH.
- 2. The applicant entity shall submit a copy its current draft Siting Profile to the Town Manager. Other than Section C (Letter of Support or Non-Opposition) and its attachment, the Siting Profile shall be complete, including attachments.

The applicant entity shall promptly provide a copy of any amendments to its draft Siting Profile and, prior to filing with DPH, a copy of its final Siting Profile, to the Town Manager.

In the event of any changes to the Siting Profile after a letter of support or nonopposition has been approved by the Board, other than completion of Section C and necessary attachments thereto, the hearing shall be reopened unless the Town Manager determines that the changes are minor or technical in nature.

Other than compliance with the Open Meeting Law, the hearing on approval of a letter of support or non-opposition shall not require any specific form of notice. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Town Manager shall attempt to provide reasonable public notice at least ten days before the hearing by measures such as: posting on the Town's website, email to the Needham Times, Hometown Weekly, and The Needham Channel, and a list serve available to the public through the Notify Me feature of the Town website.

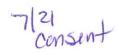

Re: 20B Exemption – Traveling Meals Summer Program

The Needham Public Health Department hires packers/drivers to staff the Traveling Meals Program during the summer when volunteers are not available. The Summer Traveling Meals Program may run from June 24, 2015 through September 2, 2015. The summer packers/drivers hired by the Public Health Department are listed below; three of the four persons that will be employed by the Traveling Meals Summer Program hold positions with the Needham Public Schools during the academic year. The fourth person is a Needham resident not otherwise employed by the Needham Public Schools, the Town of Needham, or its departments. I certify that all of the four persons who will be employed as packers/drivers for the Summer Traveling Meals Program meet the eligibility criteria listed below:

- 1. The second job (or contracted service) must be with a completely independent agency, department or board. The individual may not participate in or have any official responsibility for any of the activities of the second agency, and the first agency must not regulate the activities of the second agency. [All persons who will be employed by the Summer Traveling Meals Program meet this criteria; the Needham Public Schools does not regulate the Needham Public Health Department.]
- 2. The position must be publicly advertised. [It was publicly advertised by the Town's Human Resources Department.]
- 3. The individual must file a statement disclosing the second job or contract with the Town Clerk. [All persons who will be employed by the Summer Traveling Meals Program have filed this certification with the Town Clerk, Theodra Eaton.]
- 4. The second job or contracted services must be performed outside the normal working hours of the first position. [The Summer Traveling Meals Program occurs during the summer months when the Needham Public Schools are not in session.]
- 5. The services performed in the second job or contract must not be part of the employee's duties in the first job. [Work performed for the Summer Traveling Meals in no way relates to the duties performed at the Needham Public Schools.]
- 6. The employee must not be compensated in the second position (or contract) for more than 500 hours per year. [Work performed for the Summer Traveling Meals will occur June 24,

2015 and September 2, 2015 for a total of 11 weeks; no person employed by the Summer Traveling Meals Program will exceed 500 hours worked over the course of those week.]

- 7. The department manager of the second agency, department or board must file a written certification with the Town Clerk that no employee of the agency is available to do the work as part of their regular duties. [As the Director of the Needham Public Health Department, I have filed such a declaration with the Town Clerk, Theodra Eaton.]
- 8. The Board of Selectmen must approve the 20(b) exemption. [This step is pending; it awaits the consent of the Board of the Selectmen at its next meeting in July 2015.]

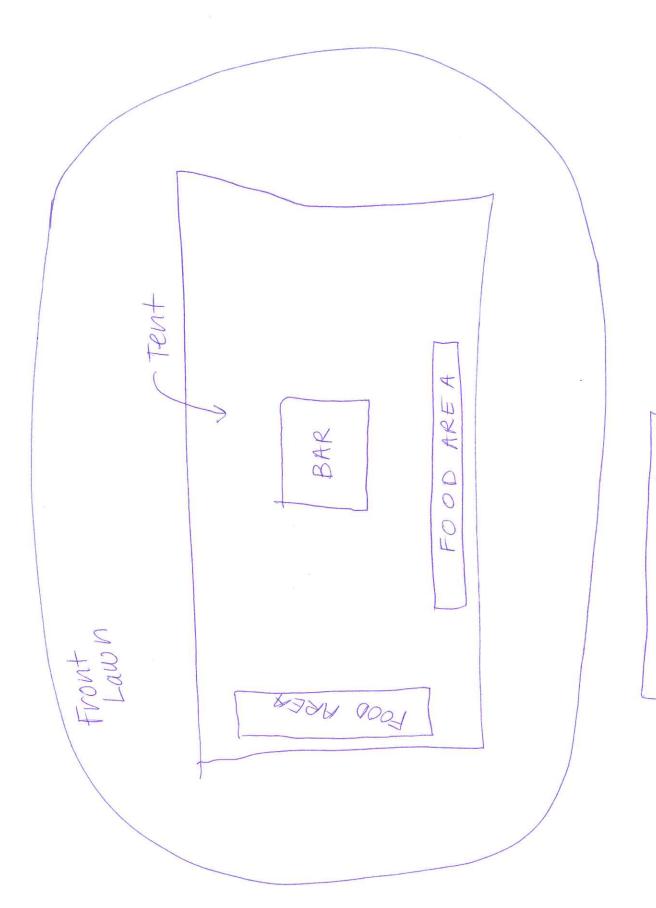

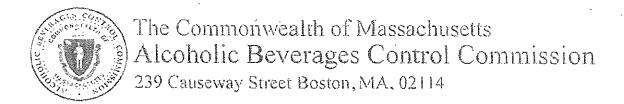

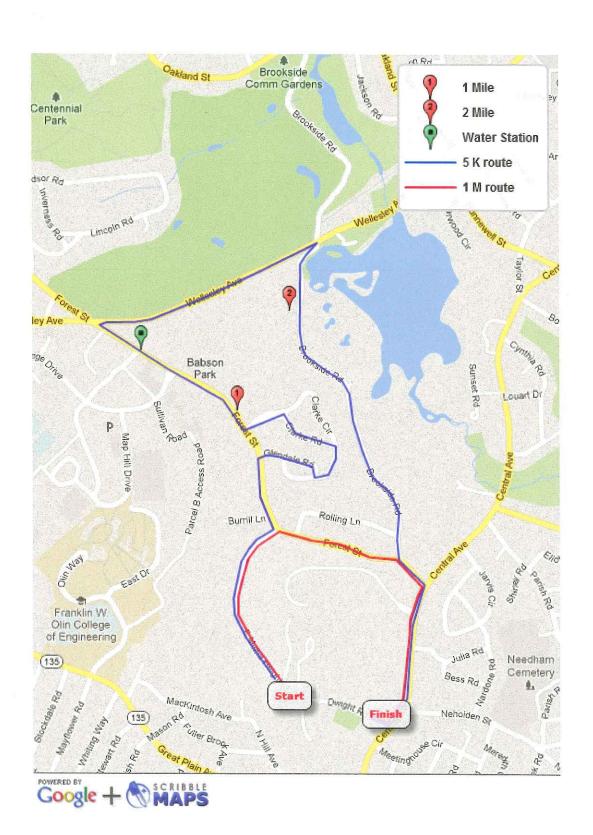

How we would like to use your site:

On Friday, September 25th, we would like to establish a rest stop at **Ridge Hill Reservation** for the participants of the BRAKING AIDS® Ride. At our rest stops, we provide our dedicated Riders and Volunteers the opportunity to get some rest, drink water, get snacks, and if necessary, get medical attention. Specifically we would like to set up two 10' x 10' tents to serve water and snacks, and to use the bathroom facilities on site. This set-up can be on a grassy area or on pavement, whatever is preferable for you.

Staff

Volunteers staff the rest stop. Each volunteer team has a manager who has worked with the BRAKING AIDS® Ride staff for months to prepare for the event. There are also staff members who move up and down the route to ensure the event progresses smoothly.

Equipment

The Volunteer team of approximately three people arrives in the morning to begin setting up the rest stop. They will arrive in a minivan and a cargo van. Rest stops each have two 10' x 10' tents; one for beverages and snacks, and one for first aid. The van contains all the supplies needed to operate a rest stop, including tables and chairs, trashcans, coolers, etc.

As part of this permit request, we hope to use the bathroom facilities on site for our participants. If this is not possible, a vendor can place two portable toilets the afternoon before the rest stop will be used. The vendor is given a site drawing instructing them where to place the toilets. As we have done in the past we would like to bring in portable restrooms on Thursday, Afternoon September 24, 2014 and picked up either the Afternoon of the 24th or the Morning of September 28, 2015, whichever you prefer. A staff member is also responsible for checking placement that afternoon.

Hours of Operation

The rest stop has hours of operation as listed at the top of this page. The Riders are aware of the hours of operation. The hours are also posted at the rest stop. Riders who are not able to keep pace with the route hours or who are unable to continue for other reasons will be picked up in a sweep vehicle. Riders will only be permitted to pass through the rest stop during the hours of operation.

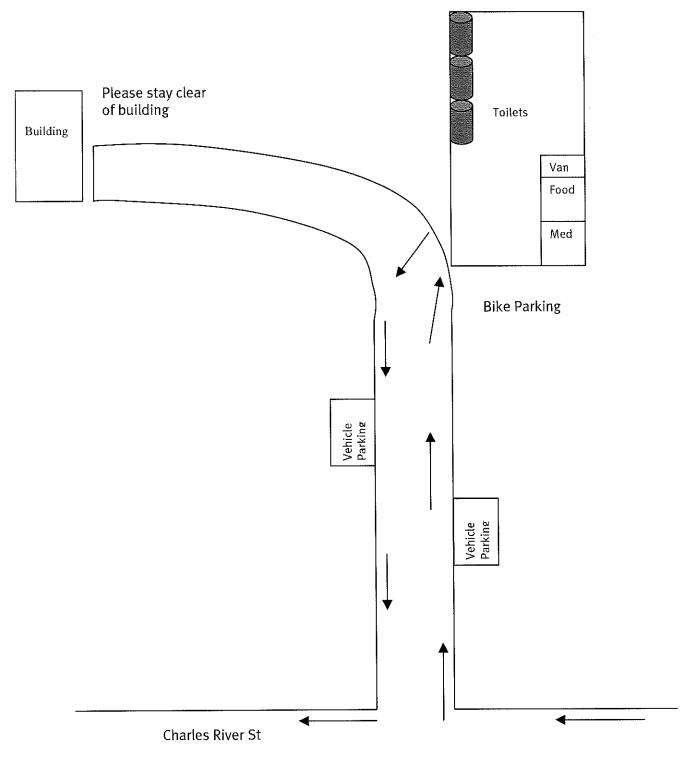
Insurance

Cleanup

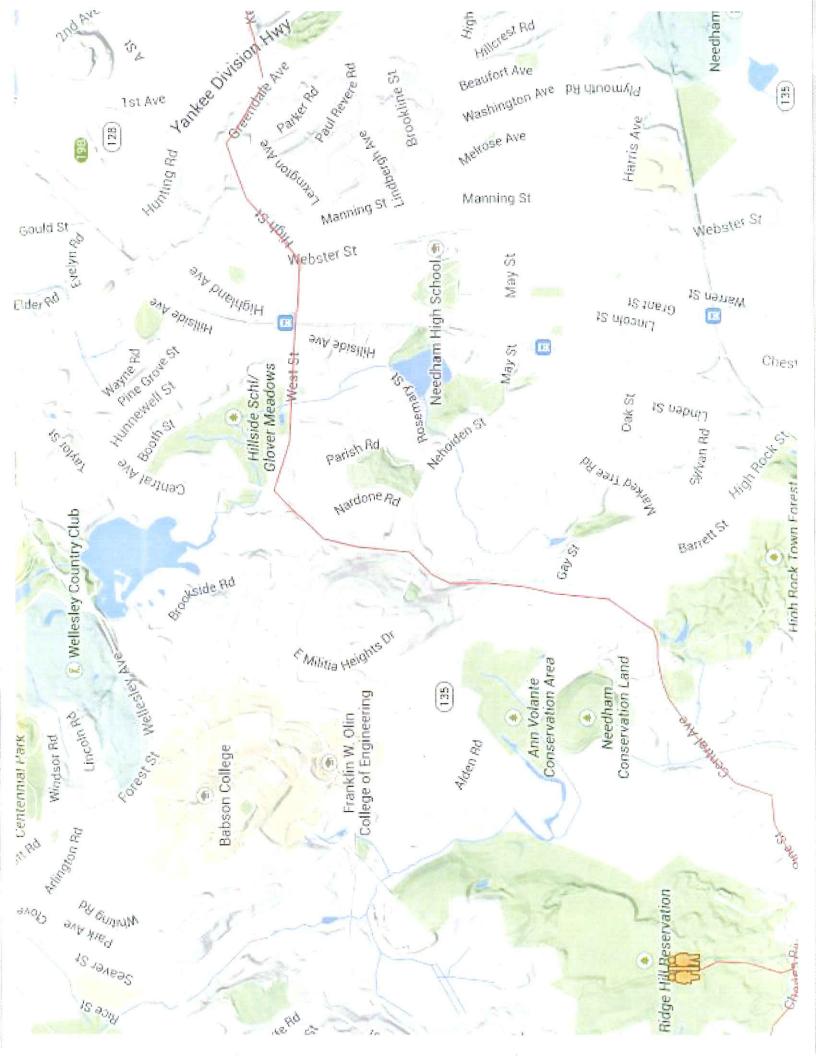

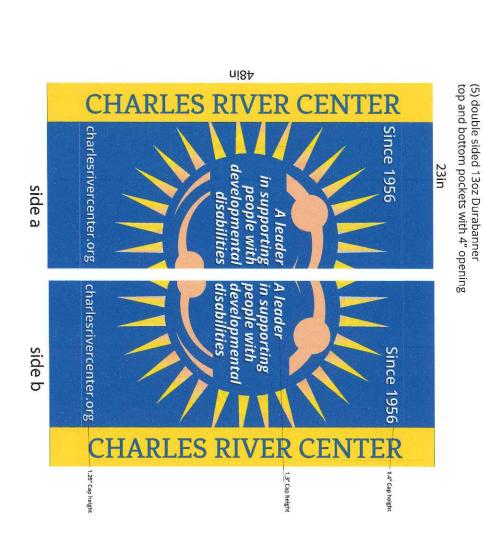
