TOWN OF NEEDHAM SCHOOL SAFETY INITIATIVES



Needham Fire Department's Pre-kindergarten and kindergarten fire safety program includes:

- Teaching students how to dial 911
- Telling students what to do when the smoke alarm or carbon monoxide alarm sounds
- Practicing "Stop, Drop and Roll" and "Crawl Low Under Smoke"
- Discussing the importance of escape plans and having a meeting place
- Instructing students to stay away from hot things

The Third grade fire safety program includes:

- Teaching students about fire and key safety words
- Providing information on the role of the firefighter
- Letting students know how to report a fire or other emergency
- Providing information about what to do when the smoke alarm or carbon monoxide alarm sounds
- Practicing "Stop, Drop and Roll" and "Crawl Low Under Smoke"
- Discussing escape plans, two ways out and having a meeting place
- Talking about avoiding hot things and what to do in the event of a burn
- Reminding students that matches and lighters are to be used by adults only in very rare circumstances by children with adult supervision (i.e.,
 Boy Scouts/Girl Scouts camping)
- Explaining that the careless use and disposal of smoking-related materials can lead to preventable fires, injuries and even death
- Teaching students that tobacco is harmful to their health and can lead to life threatening illnesses

The Needham Fire Department also participates in many school activities such as school fairs.







Needham Police School Resource Officers partner with the Needham Public Schools to:

- Build positive relationships and connect with students, staff and parents, helping to maintain a safe and nurturing school environment.
- Provide training on ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate), the new school safety protocol.
- Collaborate with school administrators on emergency crisis planning, building security matters, truancy and bullying situations.
- Work with guidance counselors and other student support staff to assist students when needed.
- Provide training for school personnel in handling crisis situations.
