The Basics

- Needham Town Meeting started in 1711.
- Change to Representative Town Meeting in 1933.
- > 254 elected and at-large members.
- Proportional representation of Needham's 10 Precincts.
- The legislative branch of government.
- Town Meeting exercises "all powers vested in the municipal corporation."

The Members

- Non-partisan nomination papers "shall bear no political designation."
- Members represent only their neighbors, not any faction, caucus or interest group.
- Members must
 - be informed
 - act in the best interests of their constituents and the Town as a whole.
 - attend Town Meeting and vote.



A Citizen Legislature

- > Self-Governance, pure and simple.
- Engage with constituents, solicit views
- > Evaluate the Articles in the Warrant.
- At the meeting, respectfully ask questions and share viewpoint.
- Make motions under an Article (e.g., amend, divide, refer).
- Vote on subsidiary motions and Main Motion.
- Be a representative between town meetings.

Other Key Participants at Town Meeting

Select Board

- Elected Executive Branch of Town Government.
- Serves as the Warrant Committee, sets the agenda in the form of the Warrant.
- Often is the proponent of Main Motions.

> Finance Committee

- Nine citizens appointed by the Moderator.
- Represent the legislative branch year-round.
- Provides Members with recommendations on each article found to have financial implications.
- Sponsors and presents the Operating budget.



Other Key Participants at Town Meeting

- Planning Board
 - Elected to oversee land use per state law.
 - Proposes new and amended zoning by-laws.
- Community Preservation Committee
 - Appointed to administer funds collected under the Community Preservation Act.
- Personnel Board
 - Five citizens appointed by the Moderator
 - Represents the interests of the legislative branch.
 - Advises on human resource issues and makes recommendations to Town Meeting on HR articles.

Process

- Boards and committees work all year to prepare for Town Meeting.
- Public hearings, discussions, negotiations precede Town Meeting.
- Town Meeting is not about someone, or some group "winning" or "losing."
- There are no "sides" at Town Meeting
- Everyone is focused on what is best for our town.
 - Discussion ≠ Destruction
 - Debate ≠ Battle
 - Disagreement ≠ Division



Process - Moderator

- Town Meeting is conducted under state law, municipal law (Town Charter and By-Laws), rules and tradition.
- State law empowers the Moderator to:
 - preside and regulate the proceedings
 - decide all questions of order
 - declare all votes
- Enforce the rules of procedure and the rules adopted by the meeting.



Process -- Decorum

- > Town Meeting adopts its own rules, including rules on decorum.
- Is there a "right to be rude?"
 - Not at Representative Town Meeting
 - Barron v. Kolenda (SJC decision March 7)
- > Public Comment v. Rep. Town Meeting
 - Elected Members
 - Adopt and impose their own rules
 - Moderator maintains order under state law

Process – The Business of Governing Needham

- > Article describes a Main Motion
 - A "motion" means to take action
- > Role of the Consent Calendar
 - Contents Determined by the Members
- Presentation and discussion of a Main Motion (Select Board, Finance Comm.)
- Respectful floor discussion and motions
 - Questions, additional information, sharing views
- > Vote on motions and Main Motion.
- Move on to the next Article in sequence.

Purpose

- > To empower citizens to govern themselves.
- Rooted in the most fundamental concepts of our nation. (The model for our system)
- Permit ordinary citizens to not only opine on but decide the most important decisions.
 - We do not outsource governance in Needham
 - You have a voice and an essential role
- Town Meeting, boards and committees are a real system of checks and balances.
- Not a "rubber stamp" and never should be.
- No "winners" or "losers."



Purpose

- Let's set an example for the town, for Massachusetts and the nation.
- Let's show the benefits of volunteerism and community involvement.
- Let's reject partisanship and polarization.
- Let's reject demonization and disrespect of contrary views.
- Let's demonstrate what cordial, merits-based discussion, deliberation and engagement look like.
- > And let's avoid this....
