#### **Essential Job Functions**

An employee in this position may be called upon to do any or all of the following essential functions. These examples do not include all of the duties which the employee may be expected to perform. To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function to satisfaction.

- Performs preventative maintenance on municipal vehicles, machinery, and equipment.
- Performs diagnostics and repairs on vehicles, machinery, and equipment reported by operators and supervisors/department heads.
- Performs basic auto body work, refinishes apparatus, and performs related welding and sandblasting work.
- Keeps detailed maintenance and repair records using fleet management software.
- Receives and stocks inventory of parts and supplies for municipal vehicles and equipment.
- Builds and fabricates materials for vehicle and equipment repairs.
- Performs annual state inspections on all road vehicles and machinery.
- Maintains work area and equipment in safe and operable condition, adhering to all applicable safety and health rules and regulations.
- Mandatory participation in the Snow & Ice Program; may include road treatment, plowing, snow hauling, etc.
- Performs other related job duties as required.

# **Physical and Environmental Working Conditions**

The physical and environmental demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential function of this job.. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

- The nature of duties may involve continuous presence of unpleasant or irritating elements, such as considerable noise, odors, exhaust and chemical fumes, toxic agents, dust, smoke, hot or cold temperature extremes, wetness and humidity, oil, dirt/dust, grease, dim lighting, vibrations, electrical currents, and heavy machinery.
- Work may be continually performed in typical shop conditions or outdoors, regardless of weather conditions. May be required to be on call for 24 hours or be under prolonged pressure during emergency situations.
- Duties involve assignments requiring application of hand-eye coordination with finger dexterity and motor coordination.
- Visual demands require routinely reading documents for general understanding and analytical purposes. Frequent computer use. Visually inspects surroundings and fine details to assess conditions of vehicles and equipment.
- Work requires moderate and intermittent physical strength and effort daily, such as lifting heavy objects, carrying the object(s), and stacking them or placing them in a vehicle or storage area. In addition, pulling, pushing, standing, or walking for the full workday may also be involved. A great deal of physical effort must be exerted at this level.
- Must be able to life and/or move up to and including 50 pounds and sometimes lift 50+ pounds.
